LIGHTSHIP, KEPPEL BAY, PORT OF
ROCKHAMPTON.

ALIGHTSHIP is now placed in seven fathoms water, four and a half cables S.S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. of the Elbow Buoy.

On and after this date, she will exhibit, between sunset and sunrise, a bright light, at an elevation of forty-four feet above the sea.

Vessels entering the port at night, should bring the Lightship to bear to the southward

of S.S.W., before getting the two lights at the Pilot Station in one—the light being visible from the Timandra Bank buoy, when the eye is twelve feet above the water, and proportionately further from a greater elevation. Immediately the Lightship is brought to the southward of S.S.W., vessels may haul up, to round the Timandra Bank buoy.

After passing within a mile of Sea Hill Point, steer so as to pass within a cable's length to the eastward of the Lightship. Haul up close round to the southward of her, and steer west-northerly, leaving a black buoy and a black beacon off Raglan Creek, on the port hand, and passing at about a cable's distance to the southward of the large Mangrove Island.

By passing to the southward of the Lightship as above directed, nothing less than fifteen feet of water will be found in the channel at low water spring tides.
