WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled, “The Gold Fields Act, 1866,” it is enacted

that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the public Seal of the Colony, from time to time, to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the Act now in recital, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven, of the said Act, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esquire, as Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, all the powers vested in me, under or by virtue of the said “Gold Fields Act, 1866,” except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven, to have, hold, and exercise, within the Province of Auckland, the said powers hereby given to the said John Williamson, Esquire, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that copies of all Rules and Regulations made under the delegation aforesaid shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the one hundred and tenth clause of “The Gold Fields Act, 1866.”

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, at the Government House, at Wellington, and issued under the Seal of the said Colony this twenty-seventh day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the 27th day of April, 1867.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled

"The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," (section 4) the Governor may, by any Order in Council from time to time, annul, make void, or alter, or vary, and make anew any Orders in Council, regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations made and published by the Governor under the authority of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," or of this Act, or by the Superintendent of any Province, under or in pursuance of any power delegated to him under any of the powers of delegation contained in the said Act; and whereas by section five of the said Amendment Act "as to regulations, appointments, and prohibitory and other declarations made by Superintendents of Provinces in pursuance of any powers delegated under the powers of delegation contained in the said Act, or this Act, the power of annulling, making void, or allowing, or varying, and making anew any such regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations vested in the Governor by this Act, may from time to time be delegated by the Governor in Council by warrant under his hand to the Superintendent of any Province:"

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir George Grey, K.C.B., in exercise of the power and authority so vested in him as Governor as aforesaid, doth by this Order in Council delegate to

JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esq.,

Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, so long and so long only as he shall continue to be such Superintendent, all the powers which by the said fourth section of the said Amendment Act the Governor in Council is authorised so to delegate.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the twenty-seventh day of April, 1867.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Marine Act, 1866," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time, delegate all or any of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, unto any person or persons, for any period, and subject to any regulations, restrictions, or stipulations which may be specified in such Order, and every such delegation may from time to time alter or revoke:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Bath, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of

the Executive Council of the Colony, do, by this Order, delegate unto

JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esq.,

Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, such of the powers vested in me as Governor by section seven of the said Act as enable me to erect, superintend, and maintain harbour marks, lights, and beacons now or hereafter to be placed within the limits of any port in the Province of Auckland, or the approaches thereto, subject however to such directions as may from time to time be issued by the Colonial Marine Engineer, as to the size, position, and colour of such harbour marks, lights, and beacons; and to appoint and suspend or remove Port or Harbour Masters, and other officers of ports or harbours within the Province of Auckland; and to define and regulate the conduct and duties of Port or Harbour Masters, and other persons employed in carrying out the objects of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and of "The Marine Act, 1866," within the said Province; and also, within the said Province, the powers vested in me by clauses ten, eleven, fifteen, and thirty-seven of the said last mentioned Act, and the power vested in me by clause sixteen of the said last-mentioned Act, to exempt from pilotage, within all or any of the ports of the Province of Auckland, such Colonial trading vessels to the ports of such Province only as to him shall seem proper to be so exempted; to have and exercise the said powers hereby delegated to the said John Williamson, Esq., so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer, subject nevertheless to such regulations as may from time to time be made by the Governor in Council under authority of clause fifty-one of the said last-mentioned Act.

NOTICE.

WHEREAS by the "East Coast Land Titles Investigation Act, 1866," it is enacted that the provisions of the "Native Land Act, 1865," respecting the powers and proceedings of the Native Land Court, shall, except as therein is otherwise provided, be applicable to the proceedings of the said Court under the said Act now in recital; and it is further provided that within the District, the boundaries whereof are defined in the Schedule to the said Act and hereunder, the Native Land Court shall have full power and jurisdiction to enquire into and determine the title to all and any land or lands, whether claimed by or belonging to Aboriginal Natives or other British subjects, and whether or not such investigation shall be required on the part of any person or persons claiming title thereto, and to award by certificate, issued under the direction of the Court, that grants of land may be made to such Natives or other persons respectively who shall be found to be entitled thereto as shall not have been engaged in the rebellion, and in those cases in which it shall be found that Natives who have been engaged in the rebellion are, or but for such participation in rebellion, would have been entitled to land jointly with other Natives who shall not have been so engaged, to make an equitable partition of such land, to assign to the Natives so entitled who shall not have been so engaged their just portion of such land, and to ascertain and certify what lands are, or but for participation in the rebellion, would have been the property of persons who have been engaged in rebellion.

And whereas on or about the 26th day of April instant a requisition was made to me by the Honorable James Crowe Richmond, one of the members of the Executive Council of the Colony, to fix a sitting of the Native Land Court for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned.

Now, therefore I, Francis Dart Fenton, Esq., the Chief Judge of the said Native Land Court, in execution of the power vested in me under the "Native Land Act, 1865," and the rules made thereunder, and in pursuance of the said recited Act, do hereby fix a sitting of the Native Land Court, to be holden at Turanganui, in the Province of Auckland, on the third day of July next, for the purposes hereinbefore set forth, with reference to the said block of land described in the Schedule hereunder written.
