## PUBLIC NOTIFICATION

By JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Auckland.

**U**NDER and in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, by "The Sheep Act, 1863," made and passed by the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, I the Superintendent, do hereby appoint and constitute all that land, estimated to contain 214,000 acres, known as the Tauranga Block, bounded on the north-east by the sea, from the mouth of Wairaki Creek to Ngakuriawhare point; on the south-east by a line bearing south  $45^{\circ}$  west (true) 16 miles; thence on the south-west by a line bearing north  $45^{\circ}$  west (true) to the summit or watershed of the dividing range of hills between the east coast and the Thames valley; and thence following the said watershed northward to the summit of the Aroha Mountain; and on the north-west by a straight line from the summit of the Aroha Mountain to Ngakuriawhare Point, to be a district for the purposes of the said Act, under the name of "THE TAURANGA SHEEP DISTRICT."

## NOTIFICATION.

**W**HEREAS by an Act made and passed by the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, intitled the "Auckland Municipal Police Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that the Superintendent may from time to time, by public notification in the Provincial Government Gazette, appoint and define the limits of cities, towns, and other places within the Province of Auckland, for the purposes of this Act.

Now therefore I, the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, pursuant to the authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that for the purposes of the said "Auckland Municipal Police Act, 1866," the limits of the TOWN OF TAURANGA, within which the said Act shall come into force, shall comprise the whole of the lands originally purchased by the Church Missionary Society between Te Papa Point and the Gate Pa, together with the village of Greerton.

## CONDITIONS.

*(Applicable to the preceding Contracts)*

Samples of the various articles to be supplied will have to be submitted for inspection if required.

The contractors for supplies will be required to deliver the same from time to time at such places, and in such quantities, as may be directed by the Superintendent.

The contractors for the performance of any work or service will be required so to perform the same, as it may be ordered for the Provincial Government by some officer authorised by the Superintendent in that behalf.

The Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any of the tenders sent in.

Any of the contracts may be annulled upon the expiration of one calendar month's notice, in writing, of an intention to discontinue the same, to be given by the contractor on the one part, or by the Superintendent, or by some person authorised by him, on behalf of the Provincial Government, on the other part.

Payment for any of the above supplies, works, or services, will be made monthly, after the bills have been rendered in a complete state by the contractor, and passed.

Tenders to be sealed, and endorsed "Tender for (name of article or service)."

In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the Officer receiving the supplies, the same is to be decided (in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature), by a Board of Survey,

composed of persons named by the Government. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing which, it will be procured by the department requiring it, and the expense charged to the contractor.

In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or in which, from some other cause, injury would be sustained by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge, for whom the supplies are to be received, shall have power to reject any article of a quality inferior to the approved sample, and to purchase others at the expense of the contractor.

In the event of the contractor for the performance of any work or service being dissatisfied with the decision of the officer in condemning the same, the Superintendent will, upon the written request of the Contractor, made immediately after such decision, and the Superintendent may also, at any time, without such request, summon a Board of Survey to examine any work; and if such Board of Survey shall declare any such work to be inferior in quality to the work contracted for, or otherwise improperly done, the Contractor, upon notice thereof, shall immediately replace such work by other, satisfactory to the Board of Survey; and in default thereof, the Superintendent, or some officer authorised by him in that behalf, is hereby authorised to procure such work to be replaced in any manner he may think fit, and the contractor shall bear and pay to the Provincial Government all costs, charges, and expenses attendant thereon, as well as any excess of price for the same, together with a sum of money, by way of penalty, equal to one-fourth of such costs, charges, and expenses, and excess of price, all of which are hereby made chargeable on any sum which may be due from the Provincial Government to the contractor.

The tenders (forms of which may be obtained at this office) to contain the names and places of residence, at length, of the persons tendering, and to be signed by two respectable sureties, engaging to become bound in a penalty of £100 for the fulfilment of the contract if the tender be accepted, and no tenders will be received unless upon such forms.

All contract bonds must be signed by the contractor and his sureties before the date of entering upon the contracts.

No person whatever holding any situation of profit or emolument under Her Majesty's Government of New Zealand, or under the Government of this Province, shall be a party directly or indirectly to any Contract.
