HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that he will hold a Levee, at the Government House, Auckland, on Saturday, the 28th instant, at Two o'clock, p.m.

The Members of both Houses of the General Assembly, and other gentlemen provided with cards of *entree*, will assemble in the drawing-room, and the general circle in the dining-room.

Each gentleman is requested to bring with him two cards, with his name printed or written thereon; one to be left in the entrance hall, and the other to be given to the Aide-de-Camp in waiting.

It is requested that those who attend the Levee (with the exception of visitors from the country, and others who may not be able conveniently to conform to the usual regulations in this respect,) will wear

either official dress, uniform, or evening costume.
