### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington,  
this twenty-sixth day of August, 1868.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:

**W**HEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Gold Field, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts, for the administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens of such Courts, with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner, and to exercise all or any of the powers thereinafter mentioned, as the Governor shall think fit to direct;

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth

hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him for this purpose, appoint

LOWTHER BROAD, Esq.,

to be a Warden of all Wardens' Courts now constituted or hereafter to be constituted within the Gold Fields of the Province of Auckland, with power to him to act alone or with assessors, and to exercise all or any of the powers vested in or imposed on Judges of Wardens' Courts.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington,  
the twenty-sixth day of August, 1868.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:

**W**HEREAS by "The Bay of Islands Settlement Act, 1858," it is amongst other things provided, that, within the settlement constituted under the said Act, all the waste lands of the Crown, and all land reserved or taken for the purposes of the said Act, shall be held and disposed of under the provisions of the said Act, and not otherwise, and that it shall be lawful for the Governor within such settlement to cause a town to be surveyed and laid out, and also suburban and rural allotments, and

that all such town, suburban, and rural lands shall be let, sold, occupied, and disposed of for such prices, in such manner, for such purposes, upon such terms, and subject to such regulations as the Governor in Council shall from time to time prescribe for that purpose: And whereas it is expedient that regulations should be made and prescribed for the letting of lands in the said settlement containing coal:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby make and prescribe the regulations in the Schedule hereto, for the letting, occupation, and disposal of such of the waste lands of the Crown in the said settlement as contain coal.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. It shall be lawful for the Superintendent for the time being of the Province of Auckland, from time to time, by private contract or otherwise as to him may seem fit, to agree with any person or persons for the lease of any land within the said settlement containing coal, not being land laid out as a town or in suburban allotments: provided that the land to be comprised in any such lease shall not exceed an area of two square miles and that no such lease shall be for a term exceeding twenty-one years.

2. Every such lease shall be executed by the Governor in the name of Her Majesty, and a rent or royalty shall be reserved therein at a rate of not less than six-pence for every ton of coal raised during the term of the lease on the land in the said lease comprised, and shall contain clauses, to be framed to the satisfaction of the Governor, for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned; that is to say—

- (1.) For securing payment of the royalty or rent.
- (2.) For enabling the Governor, or some person authorized by him, from time to time, to enter and view the demised premises, and every part thereof.
- (3.) For securing the regular, proper, and efficient winning and working of the coal and other minerals.
- (4.) For enabling the Governor, and all persons authorized by him, to have access in, through, and over the demised lands, and all mines and shafts to be driven or sunk therein, and to make roads, adits, and approaches through and over the same, without making any compensation, and to make use of any canal, railroad, or tramway constructed or to be constructed by the lessee therein or thereupon, upon making reasonable compensation for the same.

(5.) For securing the delivery and surrender of the demised lands at the expiration or other sooner determination of the term, with all improvements thereon, in good and tenantable repair, to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors.

(6.) For determining and making void the lease, upon breach on the part of the lessee of any of the conditions, stipulations, or provisions therein contained or implied.

NEWLY DISCOVERED DANGERS OFF NORTH HEAD, AUCKLAND HARBOUR.

Marine Department,

THE following Notice to Mariners, announcing the discovery of a sunk rock and sandbank in the vicinity of North

Head, Auckland Harbour, and describing the buoys which have been placed to mark the same, which has been prepared by the Chief Harbour-master of Auckland, is published for general information.

A rocky patch, about one third ( $\frac{1}{3}$ ) of a cable's length in extent, with only eight (8) feet water over the centre of it at low spring tides, deepening to two and a half ( $2\frac{1}{2}$ ) and three (3) fathoms towards its edge, having been discovered between Takapuna Head and the Rough Rock:—

Notice is hereby given that a red buoy has been placed on the east side of the rock, and lies in two and a half ( $2\frac{1}{2}$ ) fathoms at low water spring tides, with the following mark and compass bearings:—

Rough Rock buoy on with centre of	
Koreho Island	- - East.
Takapuna Head	- - W.S.W.
Flagstaff, Mount Victoria	- S.W. by S.
Extreme of North Head	- S. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.

Notice is also given that consequent upon a sandbank having grown up near the Rough Rock (about half a cable's length in extent), with only twelve (12) feet water over its shoalest part at low spring tides, a buoy (striped red and black) has been placed on the south-eastern edge of the said bank, and lies in three (3) fathoms at low water spring tides, with the following mark and compass bearings:—

Mount Eden, just open of the North	
Head	- S.S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.
Rough Rock buoy	- N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.
Flagstaff, Mount Victoria	- S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.

Masters of vessels in entering Auckland Harbour, are cautioned not to approach too near to the western shore of Rangitoto Channel, as rocky ledges and foul ground extend from two to three cables' lengths from the shore. Neither is it prudent for large vessels to take the channel in-shore (westward) of the Rough Rock, although it is now well marked by the addition of the buoys above-mentioned.

NOTE.—The Rough Rock buoy lies on the eastern edge of the rock, in three (3) fathoms at low water. Vessels passing in-shore of it, should not approach it within a cable's length, as foul ground extends for some distance around the rock.
