REVISED CODE OF REGULATIONS.

THE following Notice, relating to alterations in the Code of Signals at the Mount Victoria Station, is directed to be published for general information.

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after the 10th December proximo, the local Signals now in use at the Signal Station will be discontinued, and the following revised Code, authorised by the Colonial Marine Engineer, adopted in lieu thereof.

FLAGSTAFF, MOUNT VICTORIA, NORTH SHORE.

A red and blue swallow-tail flag, red uppermost	A sail in sight.
A red and blue swallow-tail flag, blue uppermost	2 do.
A red and yellow swallow-tail flag, red uppermost	3 do.
A red and yellow swallow-tail flag, yellow uppermost	4 do.

A red and yellow swallow-tail flag, yellow uppermost; and a red and blue swallow-tail flag, red uppermost	...	5 do.
Two yellow and blue swallow-tail flags, yellow uppermost	...	6 do.

DESCRIPTIVE SIGNALS.

A red and blue swallow-tail flag, red uppermost, dropt below western yard arm	A Steamer.
A red and blue swallow-tail flag, red uppermost, at western yard arm	A Schooner.
A red and blue swallow-tail flag, red uppermost, at half-western yard arm	A Brig.
A red and blue swallow-tail flag, red uppermost, at half-eastern yard arm	A Barque.
A red and blue swallow tail flag, red uppermost, at eastern yard arm	A Ship.
A red and blue swallow-tail flag, red uppermost, dropt below eastern yard arm	A Cutter.

NOTE.—When more than one vessel of the same rig is in sight, the descriptive signals will be the same as those shewn for more than one sail in sight.

A red pennant over the flag for a sail in sight, or over the descriptive signal, denotes that the vessel signalled is outside Tiri Tiri, and inside Tiri Tiri when the pennant is under.

A blue pennant over the flag for a sail in sight, or over the descriptive signal, denotes that the vessel signalled is coming in the eastern passage, and above the passage when the pennant is under.

When the pennants are hauled down, or are not shown, the vessel is inside Rangitoto.

A blue flag half (top) mast high—a vessel in distress.

Ditto (lower) on shore.

A chequered flag (blue and white) under descriptive signal—coastwise.

Union jack over descriptive signal—a British man-of-war.

When vessels are signalled outside the Heads, or as entering the Harbour, one or more of the following signals will be made at the signal mast head as occasion may require:—

Telegraph flag	Mail on board.
Union jack	Governor on board.
Blue flag	Vessel has anchored.
Chequered flag	Vessel has gone into Kawau or other adjacent port.
White flag	Vessel has passed out of sight.
Blue flag over white flag	Vessel has put back.
No. 1. Marryat's code	Steam-tug wanted.
2.	Customs boat, or boarding officer wanted.
3.	Medical assistance wanted.
4.	Police boat wanted.
5.	Gunpowder on board.
6.	Government immigrants on board.

12.	From New South Wales.

NOTE.—When more than one vessel is signalled at the same time, and any one of the foregoing signals, or a vessel's number, be hoisted at the signal mast head, the telegraph flag will be hoisted under the description signal of the vessel to which such signal or number may refer.

Any further signals required will be made with Marryat's, or the New Commercial code of signals.

Between ALLAN O'NEILL, Plaintiff, and JEAN BAPTISTE FRANCIS POMPALIER and HUGH MOLLHON, Defendants.

WHEREAS by Virtue of a Writ of FIERI FACIAS issued in this action and directed to me, ordering me that of the Real and Personal Estate of the above-named Jean Baptiste Francis Pompallier and Hugh Mollhone I should cause to be made the sum of £244 12s. 4d., together with interest on the said sum, at the rate of eight pounds for every one hundred pounds by the year, from the 7th day of September, 1868, together with £1 13s. 4d. for the said writ and warrant thereon besides sheriff's poundage, officer's fees, &c.
