THE following Rules and Regulations for the guidance of persons licensed as Gold Field Surveyors, have been approved by the Superintendent, and are published for general information.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF PERSONS LICENSED AS GOLD FIELD SURVEYORS WITHIN THE PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND.

Length of chain to be same as Standard Measure.

1. Every Surveyor must see that this chain is corrected, and kept corrected, to the Standard Measure, provided at the office of the Engineer-in-Chief. In case a Surveyor is likely to be engaged on Field Work for some length of time, and is without the

facility of frequently testing his chain by the Standard Measure provided, in consequence of the survey being at a considerable distance from the office of the Engineer-in-Chief, the Surveyor must, before commencing the field work of such survey, carefully test his chain by the Standard Measure before described, and before using such chain in the field, he must lay down a Standard Measure for himself, on some part of or adjacent to the land to be surveyed, as may be most convenient for reference; and such Standard Measure shall be of equal length to that laid down at the office of the Engineer-in-Chief. By this Standard the chain shall be kept correct in length during the execution of the survey.

Instruments and variation of Needle.

2. Theodolites (or instruments for a like purpose) used on any survey on the Gold Fields, must be tested at least twice a year, (and more frequently if necessary,) at periods to be appointed by the Engineer-in-Chief, in order to ascertain the variation of the needle from a fixed line, representing the true meridian, which will be laid down by the Engineer-in-Chief.

Memoranda to be kept of Dates of Tests of Chain, &c.

3. Every Surveyor shall keep memoranda of the dates upon which his chain was tested and corrected, and where such examination was made; and also of the dates upon which his Theodolite, or other similar instrument, was tested for variation of the needle, so that evidence of the same may be produced before any Court, whenever it may be required.

The dates of such tests shall be regularly communicated to the Engineer-in-Chief according to the form C.

Chains and Instruments to be open to Inspection.

4. All chains, Theodolites, and other instruments used on any survey within the limits of the Gold Fields, shall be open to the inspection of the Engineer-in-Chief, and subject to his approval.

Surveys to be connected with previous Surveys and Stations.

5. Every Survey must be connected, by direct measurement, with any other former survey, trigonometrical, or other stations, which may exist at the time of the survey when such comes within half a mile of any portion of the land to be surveyed. When the land lying between the old and new survey, is free from dense bush, and where trigonometrical or other stations are visible, but beyond half a mile from any portion of the land to be surveyed, such stations shall be fixed in the following manner, where such is practicable:—

- A. If only one station is visible—Four very accurate bearings must be taken to the object, from four separate and well selected stations, forming part of the survey.
- B. If two stations are visible—Each of the stations must have very accurate bearings taken to them from four well selected stations (adjoining each other) in the survey.
- C. If three stations are visible—It will be sufficient to take very accurate bearings to each of the three stations, and a bearing from either of the next adjoining stations of the survey, to any one of the trigonometrical or other stations; always selecting the best conditioned triangle.

All the lines of bearings, intersecting these trigonometrical, or other stations, must be laid down on the map by dotted blue lines, when there is sufficient room for the purpose; but where there is not sufficient room, then a portion of each line only may be laid down; and in all cases the bearings of these lines of intersection must be written in blue below the line, and (when their length is calculated) the distance must be written in black above the line.

When the extent of the survey is small, or the measured lines very short, fixing to trigonometrical or other stations by the method described under A and B is undesirable; the angles, in such cases, will not be well conditioned, (except the stations are close to the survey,) and the results will in most cases, be unsatisfactory; it is therefore the duty of the surveyor to fix the relative position of the survey, by connecting it with three outside stations after the method described under C, when such is practicable. In addition to the above described connections, all surveys must have a bench mark or point given as a reference, such point to be marked on a rock or large tree with a broad arrow cut deeply into the wood, the kind of tree to be noted in the plan.

Streams and other features to be fixed and named.

6. All streams, or other features of the country, lying adjacent to the survey, or existing within the limits of the land under survey, must be properly fixed, and if possible, their names written on the map; and where the survey abuts upon land which has been previously surveyed, the lines and angle pegs of such former surveys which form a common boundary shall be accurately surveyed, and have the lengths and bearings of the lines, and the position of the pegs, truly shewn on map of new survey.

Boundary lines to be marked on the ground.

7. All corners of claims are to be distinctly marked on the ground, in accordance with the Gold Fields Regulations.

Size of Maps.

8. All Maps must be drawn on paper of good quality, and well seasoned. The size of the paper on which Maps are drawn must not be less than 17 x 15, in any case.

Scale of Maps.

9. The scales to be used are

For town, village, or garden allotments, and for all miners' claims, and other small areas—one chain to an inch.

For Mining Leases—Two chains to an inch.

For Agricultural Leases, Water-courses, and Roads—Four chains to an inch.

The Scale must be both drawn and written on the Map.

Meridian and Variation.

10. Each Map must have a meridian line drawn upon it, to represent the fixed meridian as laid down by the Engineer-in-Chief, and the variation from that meridian must be shewn by another line, indicating

the true meridian from the fixed meridian, as previously determined by the last test of the instrument used; and such variation shall be distinctly written in figures between the fixed and magnetic meridian, as indicated by the instrument (See specimen map.)

Lines of Construction.

11. The Map must shew the work as executed in the field.

All measured lines and figures in red.
Calculated lines and figures in black.
All observed bearings and figures in blue.
Calculated bearings and figures in black.
All tie lines, observed or measured, to be dotted in their respective colours.

Boundary of claims to be shewn by yellow marginal shading. Machine sites by pink. Mining Leases burnt sienna. Agricultural Leases or allotments by green.

Water races and permanent water to be shaded in blue, with the approximate discharge, in gallons, per second, written in blue—(ex $6\frac{1}{4}$ G).

Approximate trend of reef or leaders within the boundary of the survey or adjoining claims to be shewn on plan by red and yellow parallel lines (broken) not more than 1-100th of an inch apart, to be indicated by an arrow, pointing in the direction of the reef or leader, with the bearing written opposite the point (thus $\rightarrow 20^\circ$), the underlay to be shewn by a broad arrow with the angle given in degrees (thus $\nabla 45^\circ$).

All roads or tracks passing through the claim, to be shewn by dotted lines.

Colour to be raw sienna. Surveyed roads by defined lines of raw sienna.

Area of Quartz Claims to be given in square feet, and the number of men holding the ground, to be written along with the title of the plan.

Alluvial claims to be same as above.

Mining Leases to have the area given in acres, roods, and perches.

Machine Sites—same—acres, roods, perches.

All topographical features to be shewn on the plan by Indian ink or neutral tint, shaded of depth corresponding to the angle of inclination on the ground.

Title of Map.

12. The title of the Map must be as short as possible, and need not contain more than the name of the claim or lease, that of the district and block in which it is situate, date of the survey, and signature of the Surveyor in full.

Field Book.

13. The Map shall be accompanied with a list of the bearings and lengths of each measured line, which have been determined on the field, and must be furnished on form D; such form shall be duly dated and

signed by the surveyor, but if from any apparent error being discovered in the Map, the Engineer-in-Chief should require the Surveyor to produce the original Field Book, the Surveyor must produce it accordingly, failing which, the Map will not be approved.

Surveyor must personally superintend the field work.

14. Every survey shall be made under the personal direction of the Surveyor signing the Map; and if any Surveyor shall attach his signature to the Map of any survey which he has not personally conducted in the field, he will be liable to have his appointment as a Gold Field Surveyor cancelled.

Notice to parties employing Surveyors.

15. Parties employing gold field Surveyors for the purpose of making surveys required under the Gold Fields Regulations, are informed that upon the completion of such surveys, the Maps have to be examined in the office of the Engineer-in-Chief, and if defective, such defects must be remedied before the Map can be approved of.

Test of Accuracy of Surveys.

16. Beside any test of the accuracy of a Map, which the Engineer-in-Chief may consider necessary to make on the ground, an office test of the accuracy of the field work, plotting, and contents, will be applied through the medium of Latitudes and Departures, and by such other modes as may appear to be necessary.

Certificate of Completion of Map.

17. Upon the Map being approved by the Engineer-in-Chief, a certificate will be given to the Surveyor (if required), to the effect that the rules and regulations have been complied with (as far as practicable), and that the Map has been approved. (Form E.)

Defective Surveys.

18. Maps deposited in the Office of the Engineer-in-Chief, which are grossly at variance with the foregoing rules and regulations, or are defective or inaccurate, will at once be rejected, and a repetition of such defects will render the Surveyor liable to have his License suspended by the Chief Surveyor of Gold Fields, and his appointment cancelled at the pleasure of the Superintendent.
