At the Government House, at Wellington, this eighteenth day of August, 1869.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

**WHEREAS** by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Gold Field, or for any part thereof, Warden's Courts, for the administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens of such Courts, with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner, and to exercise all or any of the powers thereinafter mentioned, as the Governor shall think fit to direct:
