**R**EGULATIONS relative to the Receipt and Delivery of Gunpowder, and Charges for Storage, &c., in the Magazine at Mount Eden Gaol, Auckland.

- 1st. No person shall be allowed to enter the Magazine with anything on or about his person, which may be liable to cause ignition, or explosion, of any gunpowder; and it is the imperative duty of the Magazine keeper, to see that this Regulation is strictly enforced.
- 2nd. Strangers shall not have access to the Magazine without authority, and then only in the presence of the Magazine keeper.
- 3rd. The Magazine keeper shall, previous to receiving any barrel or other package of gunpowder, ascertain by a personal examination that every barrel or other package is perfectly tight and secure, and free from any possibility of an accident.
- 4th. Should any barrel or other package be discovered to be in an unsafe state, the owner must make every such barrel or package perfectly safe before the Magazine keeper receives any such barrel or package in the Magazine.
- 5th. Loose or insecure barrels or packages of gunpowder shall not be permitted to be made secure within the precincts of the Magazine, nor shall barrels or packages be opened within the Magazine.
- 6th. The Magazine keeper must be careful that every kind of friction is avoided in the removal or storage of barrels or packages, and that a sufficient space is allowed for circulation of air.
- 7th. The Magazine keeper shall, as far as practicable, keep the barrels and packages of the various owners together, and their distinguishing marks visible.
- 8th. Smoking or fire of any kind shall, under no circumstances, be permitted within the Magazine enclosure.
- 9th. Gunpowder shall not be taken from the Magazine without the necessary permits or Customs' license, nor at any other hours than those which may be appointed for the purpose from time to time by notice in the *Provincial Government Gazette*. Powder for Military purposes, when placed in the Magazine for safe keeping, being the only exception.
- 10th. Rates for storage to be :—  
 For every quarter barrel, or parcel containing 25lbs.—three farthings per week.  
 For every half barrel, or parcel containing over 25lbs, and not more than 50lbs.—three half-pence per week.  
 For every barrel, or parcel containing over 50lbs. and not more than 100lbs.—three pence per week.  
 For every barrel or parcel containing more than 100lbs. a charge of three farthings per week for every 25lbs. or fraction of 25lbs. over the 100lbs, in addition to the charge for 100lbs above named.  
 For ammunition made up in cartridges, the charge will be one-third less than the above.

#### THE PARNELL HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

##### *Amended Boundaries.*

This District shall comprise all those lands bounded on the West by the City of Auckland, as defined in the Schedule to "The City Board Act, 1863," and by the Government Domain to Whitson's Brewery Road; on the South by Whitson's Brewery Road aforesaid; on the East by the East side of the Epsom Road from Whitson's Brewery Road to the Grammar School Road, and by the Grammar School Road to the Slaughter-house Creek, thence by the said Creek to Hobson's Bay; and on the North by Hobson's Bay aforesaid, and the Waitemata Harbour; including allotment No. 1 of section 31, of the Town of Auckland (being a Hospital Endowment, Mechanics' Bay), and all roads traversing the lands within the before-mentioned boundaries.

WHEREAS, by an Order in Council made on the 19th day of April last, it was ordered by His Excellency the Governor in Council, under the authority of "The Native Lands Act, 1865," and "The Native Lands Act, 1867," that the Claim of Kerei Te Tuhi, Tautoru Tawa, Te Pukeroa Te Riaki, Matiaha Kahumu, Hare Renata, and Repiu Te Tokata, to a piece of land called "Tangonoa," situate at Hauraki, in the District of Hauraki, in the Province of Auckland, heard and determined by the Native Land Court of New Zealand, on the 4th day of February, 1870, should be re-heard before one Judge and two Assessors of the Court, and that such rehearing shall take place before the 31st day of December next.

Now, I hereby give Notice, that a Sitting of the Native Land Court will be held at Shortland, Hauraki, on the 8th day of November next, for the rehearing of the aforesaid claim.
