IN accordance with the thirteenth clause of my Proclamation of date the 21st February, 1870, for the establishment of a Mining Board for the Province of Auckland, the following Bye-laws for Standing Orders, proposed by the Board, are gazetted for public information.

BYE-LAWS FOR STANDING ORDERS OF THE MINING BOARD OF AUCKLAND THAMES GOLD FIELDS.

AT a Meeting of the MINING BOARD of the District of AUCKLAND, begun and holden at the THAMES, in the said District, on the 18th day of April, 1870, it is ordained by the said Board:—

1. That on the assembling of the Board after every Election, the Clerk shall read the Returning Officer's intimation, setting forth the names of the persons who have been elected as Members of the Board.

2. That the sittings of the Board be open to the public, except in Committee, but any one Member of the Board may require the exclusion of strangers, while the sense of the Board is taken, whether the question then under consideration shall be discussed with closed doors, or not.

3. That every Member, on first taking his seat at the Board, shall enter his name and address in a book to be kept for that purpose.

4. That on a quorum being present, the business of the Board shall commence at the time fixed, but should there be no quorum within thirty (30) minutes after that time, the Board shall stand adjourned until the next regular day and hour of meeting, and the Clerk shall record the names of the Members present.

5. That a quorum shall consist of three Members, and in the absence of the Chairman, a chairman pro. tem. shall be appointed from amongst the Members present.

6. That the regular days of meeting of the Board shall be the second Monday in each month, unless otherwise ordered.

7. That at each meeting of the Board the business shall be proceeded with in the following order—

1. The minutes of the preceeding meeting shall be read over, and corrected if necessary,

- after which the said minutes shall be confirmed, signed and dated by the Chairman.
2. Correspondence.
 3. Petitions presented by Members of the Board and ordered on.
 4. Reports of Committees received.
 5. Orders of the day.
8. That the Orders of the day shall include all business, of which due notice has been given.
9. That all motions shall be considered in the order in which notice thereof has been given in writing to the Chairman; and shall be read, signed and dated by the mover.
10. That it shall be competent for any Member to propose an original motion, or any amendment of a motion, without previous notice, provided the same shall be handed to the Chairman and read to the Board, and that it be not of a legislative character, or the effect of which would be, to rescind or amend any previous resolution of the Board.
11. That any motion or amendment, not seconded, shall not be debated, but shall lapse, and that no discussion shall be allowed on a motion for adjournment.
12. That no notice of motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with, unless by the Member giving such notice, or by some Member duly authorised by him in writing.
13. That any motion duly seconded, shall not be withdrawn, unless by the sanction of the Board, and any Member proposing a motion shall read the same, before speaking to it, in an audible voice, and deliver to the Chairman a copy of such notice, fairly written and signed, and stating the day proposed for bringing on such motion.
14. That a call of the Board for special purposes shall be made by the Chairman on the written requisition of three of the Members; and no order for a call of the Board shall be made for any day, earlier than four days from the date of such order, inclusive of the date of the same; a copy of such order to be forwarded to each Member, signed by the Chairman or Clerk.
15. The Chairman shall have a vote as a Member of the Board, and in the event of a tie taking place, he shall have a casting vote as Chairman.
16. When any motion has been duly proposed and seconded, the question shall thereon be put by the Chairman, when each Member respectively shall signify his assent or dissent by the words "Aye" or "No." The Chairman shall then state whether in his opinion the "Ayes" or the "Noes" have it, and unless his opinion be acquiesced in by the Minority, the question shall be settled by a show of hands.
17. The decision of the Chairman shall be final on all questions of "order" or "practice."
18. If more than one Member rise at the same time, the Chairman shall decide the pre-audience.
19. Any Member, upon proposing a motion or amendment, or speaking to any question, must rise and address the Chairman; and no Member shall be interrupted, unless by a call to order, when he shall resume his seat, and the question of order be decided by the Chairman, before the discussion is resumed, or any other business entered upon.
20. No member shall speak twice to a question, except in explanation or reply, and the latter only by the mover of a resolution.
21. When the mover of any resolution has exercised his right of reply, the Chairman shall put the question forthwith.
22. When the Chairman rises to address the Board, any Member then speaking shall sit down.
23. Any or each of the following acts, words, or omissions, shall constitute and be a breach of order:—
1. Addressing the Board in any other than standing posture.
 2. Interrupting another Member, while speaking,—except on a point of order.
 3. Presenting an application, disrespectfully worded.
 4. Refusing to obey the commands of the Chairman.
 5. Disorderly conduct in the Board-Room.
 6. Using offensive language to any Member of the Board.
 7. Imputing improper motives to, or making personal reflections on, a Member.
 8. Wilfully absenting himself from meetings of the Board or Committee, without permission being granted.
24. That any Member, adjudged by the Chairman guilty of any breach of order, shall not be allowed to sit at the Board, without apologising to the Board. Or may, at the discretion of the Board, be fined in any sum not exceeding Five Pounds (£5), and not less than Ten Shillings (10s.). And all monies arising from the penalties imposed by this bye-law, shall be deducted from any amount due by the Government to any member so fined, and the total amount of such fines placed to the credit of the Chairman, to be appropriated as the Board may determine.
25. All petitions shall be presented by Members of the Board only and shall be signed by the Member presenting them.
26. Any Member presenting a petition improperly worded, indecorous or disrespectful to the Board, or in which the Member presenting the same shall have any pecuniary interest, shall be liable to be adjudged guilty of a breach of order.
27. Every Member presenting a petition shall confine himself to the reading of such petition and explaining of the object, number of names attached, and in whose behalf such petition is presented.
28. No discussion shall be allowed on any petition, except on leave being given by the Board, after due notice.
29. All Committee Meetings shall be held on every Tuesday and Thursday in each week, unless otherwise ordered.
30. No Committee Report shall be adopted, unless it shall have been brought up, read & received at a previous meeting of the Board.
31. All Committees shall be appointed by a Resolution of the Board.
32. All preceding Rules for the regulation of the Board shall apply to Committees, except clause 20.
33. That any Member of the Board may be appointed Chairman of Committee.
34. Committees shall consider only such matters, as have been referred to them by the Board.
35. Every resolution passed in Committee shall be brought up by the Chairman of Committee at the next succeeding Meeting of the Board, without question and in its due order.
36. It shall be lawful for any Member of the Board to protest against the passing of Standing Orders, bye-laws or amendments thereof, and such protest shall be fairly written and signed by the Member or Members protesting, and shall be duly entered at the end of the Minutes of that Meeting and signed by the Chairman.
37. Any proposed Bye-law or Amendment of any Bye-law, or Standing Order, shall be read a first time without discussion. On a second reading a discussion may take place, and it may then be referred to a Committee of the Board, or read over a third time and passed, amended, or be disallowed; and no Bye-law disallowed shall be again proposed in the same Board during that year.

38. That Seven o'Clock P.M. shall be deemed the regular hour of all Meetings.

39. It shall be competent for the Chairman of the Board to give notice of, or move any Resolution, provided that, previous to proposing such resolution, he leave the Chair, and another Member be appointed *pro. tem.*, until such resolution or resolutions shall have been disposed of, when he shall again resume the Chair.

OPAHEKE ROAD ACT, 1870.

AN ACT to close up certain Roads in the Parish of Opaheke, in the County of Eden, in the Province of Auckland, and to authorise the Governor to grant the land occupied by the said roads to Henry Chamberlin, of Auckland, Esquire.

PREAMBLE.

Whereas it is expedient to close up the roads mentioned and described in the Schedule A to this Act annexed as being no longer required for public uses And whereas the said roads so to be closed up as aforesaid pass through certain lands the

property of Henry Chamberlain of Auckland Esquire And whereas it is expedient that the land occupied by the said roads should be granted to the said Henry Chamberlin his heirs and assigns in fee simple.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of Auckland by and with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows :

ROADS IN SCHEDULE A TO BE CLOSED.

1. From and after the passing of this Act the said roads mentioned and described in the Schedule A to this Act annexed shall be closed and cease to be used for public purposes.

LAND MAY BE GRANTED TO HENRY CHAMBERLIN.

2. It shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand to grant the land occupied by the said roads to the said Henry Chamberlin his heirs and assigns in fee simple.

SHORT TITLE.

3. The short title of this Act shall be "The Opaheke Road Act, 1870."

SCHEDULE A.

A road 100 links wide intersecting and traversing allotments 29 and 31 of the parish of Opaheke in a direction from North to South.

A road 100 links wide bounding lots 26 and 30 of the said parish on the South-west, and bounding lots 29 and 31 of the said parish on the North-east.

A road 100 links wide bounding lot 27 on the South-west and bounding lot 30 on the North-east.

A road 100 links wide, bounding lots 25 and 28 of the said parish on the West and bounding lots 24, 27, and 30 of the said parish on the East as the said roads are delineated on a plan intituled Opaheke Road Act, 1870, deposited in the Waste Lands Office at Auckland and therein distinguished by being coloured brown and marked with straight lines and dotted lines inside.
