“DIRECTIONS FOR CROSSING HOKIANGA BAR.”
“IN consequence of the Channel over Hokianga Bar having shifted a little to the Southward, two wooden beacons have been erected in Martin's Bay (painted white), which must be kept in line bearing N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., and which will lead over the deepest part of the Bar.”

SINCE the publication off the above Notice, the Channel has been working northward, and is now nearly back to its former position as marked in the Admiralty Chart. The directions for crossing the Bar, now (with a depth of 18 feet at low water) will be, to keep northward of the line of Beacons, with the Upper Beacon nearly open of the Lower Beacon, bringing both in line when over the Bar and approaching the South Head.
