Flax Commission,  
Wellington, 8th December, 1870.

THE House of Representatives having resolved that there should be an Exhibition in Wellington during the next session of the Assembly of all varieties of Flax Fibre prepared in the Colony, Manufacturers are invited to forward to the Flax Commissioners, through the Superintendent of their Province, samples of the Fibre, Rope, Sacking, or any other material prepared by them from the New Zealand Flax.
