WHEREAS by an Act of the Local Legislature of the Province of Auckland, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to Slaughter-houses," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of the said Province, by proclamation in the Provincial Government Gazette from time to time to constitute and define Slaughter-house Districts, and to appoint one or more public Slaughter-houses for each of such Districts.
