Amended Boundaries.

Commencing on the eastern coast of the Frith of the Thames at a point fifty chains or thereabouts north of the mouth of the Tararu Creek, thence by a line bearing 90° or due east to a point on Tararu Creek five chains or thereabouts north of the mouth of Fiery Creek, thence by the northern watershed of Fiery Creek and Tinker's Gully to the Look-out Rock, thence by the dividing range between Karaka Block and Tararu Block to the head of the Opitomoko Creek to the Frith of the Thames aforesaid and by high water mark of the sea thence to the point of commencement.

THE WAIOTAHU HIGHWAY DISTRICT
Amended Boundaries.
