THE TARARU HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Amended Boundaries.

Commencing on the eastern coast of the Frith of the Thames at a point fifty chains or thereabout, north of the mouth of the Tararu Creek; thence by a line bearing 90° or east to a point on the Tararu Creek, five chains or thereabout north of the mouth of Fiery Creek; thence by the northern watershed of Fiery Creek and Tinker's Gully to the Look-out rock; thence by the dividing range between Karaka block and Tararu block to the Opitomoko Creek; thence by the Opitomoko Creek to the Frith of the Thames aforesaid, and by high-water mark of the sea; thence to the point of commencement.

THE WAIOTANI HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Amended Boundaries.

Bounded towards the north-west from the Tararu Beach Road by the south-eastern boundary of the Tararu Highway District to the Look-out Rock, and thence by the watershed between the Tararu and Karaka Streams to the source of the Karaka Stream; towards the south-east by the present course of the Karaka Stream to high-water mark; and towards the south-west by high-water mark to the commencement of the beach road aforesaid; and thence by the beach road aforesaid to the point of commencement, at the Opitomoko Stream.

BY-LAW NO. 10.

A BY-LAW TO PREVENT THE ATTACHING OR PLACING OF SIGNBOARDS, GOODS, OR OTHER MATTERS OR THINGS TO OR UPON VERANDAHS OVER PUBLIC FOOTWAYS,

By-Law of the Council of the City of Auckland made under Special Order of the said Council, dated the first day of October, 1872, confirmed the fourth day of November, 1872, and sealed with the Common Seal of the Council of the said City this seventh day of November, 1872,

In pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1867, Part XIII., Section 186, the Council of the City of Auckland ordain as follows, that is to say—

Any person who shall attach or affix or cause to be attached or affixed any signboard screen or other appendage to or upon any portion of any awning or verandah over any public footway or roadway of the City or to or upon any pillar facia board roof or other portion of any verandah extending over any public footway save in accordance with the designs for verandahs approved or which may be approved by the Council of the City of Auckland or who shall hang or place or cause to be hung or placed upon or under the roof or upon any other portion of any such awning or verandah any goods wares gaspipes or

lamps or other matters or things whatsoever shall for every such offence forfeit and pay upon conviction thereof a penalty not exceeding the sum of Five Pounds.
