Delegation of certain of the Governor's Powers under "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland.

JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the Act now in recital, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of the said Act, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers:

Now, therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esq.,

as Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, all the powers vested in me under or by virtue of the

said "Gold Fields Act, 1866," except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven, to have, hold, and exercise, within the Province of Auckland, the said powers hereby given to the said John Williamson, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that copies of all Rules and Regulations made under the delegation aforesaid shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the one hundred and tenth clause of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866."

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same: and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Christchurch, this eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

Delegation of certain of the Governor's Powers under "The Gold Mining Districts Act," 1873, to the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland.

JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Christchurch, this eleventh day of December, 1873.

Present :

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER, PRESIDING.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Mining Districts Act, 1873," it is among other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to such person as the Governor in Council may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections one hundred and thirty-six and one hundred and thirty-seven, and sub-section thirteen of section one hundred and sixty-five thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such delegation; And whereas it is expedient that the Governor should delegate to the person hereinafter named the powers herein mentioned and set forth :

Now, therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority in me vested by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do, by this order under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, hereby delegate unto

JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esq.,

the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, all the powers vested in me under or by virtue of the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections one hundred and thirty-six and one hundred and thirty-seven, and subsection thirteen of section one hundred and sixty-five, thereof, to have, hold, and exercise within the Province of Auckland the said powers hereby given to the said John Williamson, so long as he shall be and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided that no rule or regulation made under the delegation aforesaid shall become or have the effect of law until the same shall have been approved by the Governor in Council, and shall have been published in the manner provided by the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Christchurch, this eleventh day of December, 1873.

Present :

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER, PRESIDING.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if and whenever he shall have, by lease, agreement or otherwise, by consent of the Native owners of any land over which the Native title has been extinguished, or the Native owners of any land over which the Native title has not been extinguished, obtained power from such Native or other owners to authorise entry on such lands

for mining for gold by Proclamation issued under the third section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to include such land within any Gold Field, or to proclaim such land a Gold Field: And by the said Act it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the preceding sections of the said Act (including the above-recited sections,) subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as the Governor may think fit:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power for that purpose vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby delegate to

JOHN WILLIAMSON, Esq.,

Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, all the powers vested in the Governor by the said recited section of "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1868," to have, hold, and exercise, within the Province of Auckland the said powers hereby delegated to the said John Williamson, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that no Proclamation affecting any lands shall be made by the said John Williamson, under the powers hereby delegated to him, unless the Governor shall have obtained power to authorise entry on such lands for mining for gold, in the manner required by the said Act.

At Christchurch, this eleventh day of December, 1873.

Present :

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER, PRESIDING.

WHEREAS by "The Lunatics' Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to order and direct that all or any of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor or the Governor in Council, or the Colonial Secretary, by the said Act, within any Province or other district of the Colony, shall be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any such Province, or by any other person the Governor may think fit: and thereupon such functions, powers, duties, and authorities may by such Superintendent or other person be exercised or performed within the Province or other district of the Colony specified:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir James Fergusson, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him, doth hereby order and direct that all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor, or the Governor in Council, or the Colonial Secretary, by

“The Lunatics Act, 1868,” within the Province of Auckland, shall be exercised by the Superintendent of such Province.

Area of Claims prescribed within the Hauraki Gold Field.

JAMES FERGUSON, Governor.

WHEREAS by “The Gold Mining Districts Act 1873,” it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, subject to the provisions of the said Act from time to time, to make amend, alter, and revoke regulations for, among other things, prescribing the area of claims, and for regulating the use and occupation of land held under the said Act, and mining operations therein and thereon: And whereas it is expedient that certain rules and regulations should be made for the purposes and in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by the said in part recited Act, do hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto: And I do hereby declare that the said rules and regulations shall be in force within that part of the Province of Auckland comprised within the “Hauraki Gold Field,” as such gold field is now constituted under the said in part recited Act, and shall take effect therein on and after the thirty-first day of December instant.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty’s Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty’s Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at Christchurch, this eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.
