WHEREAS by "The Prisoners Removal Act, 1865," it is enacted that the Governor may by warrant under his hand from time to time, when and as he may deem necessary, direct the removal from any gaol or hulk of any Province, any prisoner confined therein, to any other gaol or hulk within New Zealand, and that upon every such removal every such prisoner shall be kept at such gaol or hulk for the residue of his sentence, or until removed by legal authority:

And further, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province the powers of the said Act vested in the Governor, to be exercised within such Province, and not elsewhere:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony

Doth by this Order in Council delegate unto

JOHN WILLIAMSON, ESQUIRE,

Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, the powers of the said Act vested in the Governor, to be exercised within the Province, and not elsewhere.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal

of the said Colony, at Christchurch, this eleventh day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Waste Lands Act, 1858," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such other person as the Governor may think fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by sections three, four, and five, and also by section fourteen of the said Act, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to revoke any such powers:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the said power and authority, do hereby delegate unto

JOHN WILLIAMSON, ESQUIRE,

the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, all such powers as are vested in me by the third, fourth, and fifth sections of the said Act, so far as concerns the Waste Lands of the Crown within the said Province, without any limits or restriction whatever.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's

Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Christchurch, this sixth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

WHEREAS by the ninth section of "The Secondary Punishment Act, 1854," it is enacted, that every person, except as hereinafter mentioned, who shall be kept in penal servitude, shall, during the term of his servitude, be employed on the roads or public works, or otherwise be kept to hard labour, in such part of the Colony of New Zealand as the Governor shall in that behalf direct, and either in irons or under such other restraint, and subject to such correction as may be necessary for his safe custody and strict discipline; and for the purpose of being so employed as aforesaid, every such convict may be removed from place to place, either by sea or land, and may be confined in such public gaol, at such penal station, or in such place of confinement, or may otherwise be kept in custody, as the Governor may from time to time direct:

And whereas, by the seventeenth section of the said Act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by instructions under his hand, to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, on such terms and conditions, and subject to such limitations and restrictions as may be prescribed in that behalf, all or any of the powers therein before reserved to the Governor by the ninth clause of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient that the powers reserved to the Governor by the said ninth section of the said Act should, so far as the same are exercisable, with regard to persons sentenced to penal servitude by any court of competent jurisdiction sitting within the Province of Auckland, and so far as the same are exercisable with regard to persons sentenced to penal servitude by any court of competent jurisdiction sitting and acting beyond the limits of the said Province, and removed under lawful authority to any prison within the said Province, should be delegated to the Superintendent of the said Province:

Now, therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said seventeenth section, do hereby, by this instrument under my hand, delegate to

JOHN WILLIAMSON, ESQUIRE,

so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the said Province, all the powers reserved to the Governor by the ninth section of the said Act, but only so far as the same are exercisable with regard to persons heretofore or hereafter to be sentenced to penal servitude by any court of competent jurisdiction sitting and acting within the said Province, and so far as the same are exercisable with regard to persons heretofore or hereafter to be sentenced to penal servitude by any court of competent jurisdiction sitting or acting beyond the limits of the said Province, upon such persons being removed under lawful authority to any prison within such Province.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand

and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, and issued at Christchurch, this sixth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.
