The boat shall cross to Captain Butler's Point as soon as possible after a signal shall have been hoisted on the staff at the end of Captain Butler's store, or to the landing-place near Mr. Bruce's house as soon as possible after a fire shall have been lighted near the notice-board thereat erected.

6. Any person who shall light a fire at either place indicated for the purpose, and shall thereby cause the ferryman to cross for a passenger, shall be liable for the fare chargeable for one passenger.
