PROCLAMATION.

By His Honour SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Superintendent of the Province of Auckland.

BY virtue of the powers to me delegated by the Governor in Council, under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, under "The Gold Mining Districts Act, 1873," I do hereby exempt from occupation for mining purposes, or for machine sites, or for business, or for residence, all that portion of land situate within the boundaries of the Hauraki Gold Mining District under the said Act, which is particularly described in the Schedule hereunder: Provided always that the above exemption shall not extend to any portion of the said land now lawfully occupied for mining purposes.
