UNDER and in pursuance of the powers in me vested by the seventh section of "The Highways Act, 1874," I do hereby notify that, from and after the date hereof, all that portion of the Province of Auckland hereunder described, shall be a Dis-

trict under the said Act, and that such District shall be known by the name of

THE MATAMATA HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point where the eastern boundary of the Purewa block joins the Waitoa river, bounded towards the north by a right line from the point last named to a point on the Waihou river, where the western boundary of the Turangaomoana block joins that river; towards the east by the Waihou river aforesaid to its confluence with the Mangawhero river, thence by that river to the line which forms the southern boundary of the Turangaomoana block aforesaid; towards the south-east by part of the southern boundary of the Turangaomoana block aforesaid to the Mangawhero river, which forms part of the eastern boundary of the Hinuera block No. 1, thence by the eastern boundary of the Hinuera block No. 1 aforesaid to the north-eastern angle of the Waipa block; towards the south by the southern boundary of the Hinuera block No. 1 aforesaid, and the southern boundary of the Hinuera block No. 3 to the south-western angle of the last-named block; and towards the west by the western boundary of the Hinuera block No. 3 aforesaid, the western boundary of the Puketutu block, and the southern, western, and northern boundaries of the Te Tapui block to the Mangapapa river, thence by the Mangapapa river aforesaid to its confluence with the Waitoa river aforesaid, and by the Waitoa river to the line which forms the eastern boundary of the Purewa block, first mentioned the place of commencement.
