The above charges to be paid for each day, or part of a day, during which the animal is supplied with food and water by the Poundkeeper; but the owner may supply food and water, in which cases these charges are not to be made.

## III.—Charges for giving Notice of Impounding.

The charge for giving notice of the impounding of cattle to the owner thereof, or his agent, shall be computed at the rate of one shilling for every mile or part of a mile of the distance between the Public Pound and the usual place of residence of such owner or agent, as the case may be.

## PROCLAMATION.

By virtue of the powers in me vested by section 83 of "The Auckland Waste Lands Act, 1874," I do hereby make the following Regulations for the imposition of penalties for breaches of the Regulations for granting water rights under Part VII. of the said Act:—

1. Every person committing any breach of the said Regulations, or of any part thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).

2. Every person failing to comply with the conditions of any water right under the said Regulations, or with any part thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).
