IN pursuance of the fifth section of "The Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1863, Amendment Act, 1874," I do hereby revoke the proclamation of the TOWN OF RAGLAN District under the said Act, dated the 5th April, 1876, and published in the *Provincial Government Gazette* of the 12th April, 1876: And I do hereby notify that the District hereunder described and known as the RAGLAN District, shall from and after the date of publication hereof be and become subject to the provisions of the said Act.

THE RAGLAN DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north by the waters of the Whaingaroa Harbour from the northernmost angle of allotment No. 15 of the Parish of Karioi to the northern boundary of the Parish of Karamu, thence by said northern boundary of the Parish of Karamu aforesaid to the north-eastern angle of allotment No. 167 of said parish; towards the east by the eastern boundary of allotment No. 167 of the Parish of Karamu aforesaid and the eastern boundary of the Puketutu block to the Waitetuna river, and by the Waitetuna river aforesaid to the south-eastern angle of allotment No. 60 of the Parish of Whaingaroa; towards the south-east by the southern boundary of allotment No. 60 of the Parish of Whaingaroa aforesaid from the Waitetuna river before mentioned to the south-western angle of said allotment No. 60, thence in a westerly direction by lines being
