PROCLAMATION.

By His Honour SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight
Commander of the Most Honourable
Order of the Bath, Superintendent of
the Province of Auckland.

WHEREAS, by the eighth section of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, entitled "The Gold Mining Districts Act, 1873," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by proclamation in the General Government *Gazette* to constitute and appoint any District to be a Gold Mining District under the said Act; to assign boundaries to such district; to enlarge contract or otherwise alter such boundaries; and to declare by what local name every such district shall be designated. And whereas, by the ninth section of the said Gold Mining Districts Act, 1873, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the proclamation by which a Gold Mining District may be constituted, and from time to time by proclamation subsequently issued, either by general or particular description, to exempt from occupation for mining purposes, or for water-races, dams, or reservoirs, or for machine, business, or residence sites any land within the boundaries of any Gold Mining District. And whereas, in accordance with the provisions of the one hundred and ninetyeth and the one hundred and ninety-first sections of the said Act, the powers thus vested in the Governor by virtue of the said eighth and ninth sections of the said Act have been duly delegated to the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland. And whereas, by proclamation dated the third day of March, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, the Honourable Daniel Pollen, in exercise of the powers delegated to him as in the said proclamation mentioned, appointed a certain block of land therein described to be a goldfield under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1866." And whereas by another procla-

mation, dated the third day of March, 1875, reciting the last-mentioned proclamation, the said Daniel Pollen, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, did exempt from occupation for mining and other purposes therein mentioned all that piece or parcel of land situated at Te Kahakaha, within the said goldfield. And whereas by another proclamation dated the said third day of March, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, reciting the said first in part recited proclamation, the said Daniel Pollen, in further exercise of the said delegated powers, did exempt from occupation for mining and other purposes therein mentioned all that other piece or parcel of land situated at Karangahaki, within the said goldfield. And whereas by another proclamation, dated the third day of March, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, reciting the said first in part recited proclamation, the said Daniel Pollen, in further exercise of the said delegated powers, did exempt from occupation for mining and other purposes therein mentioned certain lands adjacent to the East Coast therein mentioned. And whereas by a proclamation dated the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in exercise of the powers therein mentioned to be delegated to me, I did enlarge and extend the Hauraki Gold Mining District, so as to include beyond its present boundaries all the block of land constituted a goldfield by the firstly hereinbefore recited proclamation, but exempting out of the said lands those several lands which, by the hereinbefore secondly thirdly and fourthly in part recited proclamations, were so exempted from occupation as aforesaid.

Now I, SIR GEORGE GREY, as such Superintendent, in exercise of the powers delegated to me as aforesaid, do hereby further enlarge and extend the said Hauraki Gold Mining District, so as to include in its present boundaries the several lands mentioned in the several proclamations hereinbefore secondly, thirdly, and fourthly in part recited. But I, the said SIR

GEORGE GREY, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, and in further exercise of the powers so delegated to me as aforesaid, do hereby exempt from occupation for mining purposes or for residence, or for business, under any miner's right or license, all the lands mentioned in the proclamations hereinbefore secondly and fourthly in part recited.

And I do hereby proclaim and declare that all the Regulations now in force in the Hauraki Gold Mining District shall be taken to be, and shall be, in force in the said Hauraki Gold Mining District as newly enlarged and extended from and after the date hereof.

THE KAUAERANGA HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Amended Boundaries.

Commencing at the northernmost angle of the Karaka South No. 2 Block: Bounded towards the north-east by the summit of the watershed range, which forms the north-eastern boundaries of the Karaka South No. 2 Block and the Hape North Nos. 1 and 2 Blocks to the easternmost angle of the Hape North No. 2 Block last named; towards the south-east by a line which forms part of the south-eastern boundary of the Hape North No. 2 Block aforesaid to the Hape Creek, and by the centre of said creek to the termination of a right line bearing south-easterly from the centre of Rolleston-street; towards the south-west by the right line before mentioned, and by the centre of Rolleston-street aforesaid and the centre of Karaka road to a point on the same opposite to the centre of Sandes street, and thence by a right line bearing north-westerly to the centre of the Karaka Creek; and towards the north-west by the centre of the Karaka Creek aforesaid, and by lines which form part of the north-western boundary of the Karaka South No. 2 Block aforesaid to the northernmost angle of the said last-named block, the place of commencement.

THE PUHOI HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Amended Boundaries.

Bounded towards the North by part of the southern boundary of the Lower Mahurangi Highway District from the north-western angle of the Parish of Puhoi to the north-eastern boundary of allotment No. 2 of the Parish of Ahuroa; towards the West by the eastern boundary of allotment No. 2 last mentioned to the northern side of the road which forms the north-western boundary of allotment No. 1 of the Parish of Ahuroa aforesaid and by the northern side of the said road and the centre of the Great North Road to the termination of a right line being the production in a southerly direction of the western boundary of allotment No. 64 of the Parish of Ahuroa, thence by said right line and by the western boundary of allotment No. 64 last described and by said boundary produced in a northerly direction to the northern side of the road which forms the northern boundary of said allotment No. 64; again towards the North by said road which also forms the northern boundaries of allotments Nos. 65 and 72 of the Parish of Ahuroa aforesaid to the western boundary of the Parish of Mahurangi; towards the East by part of the western boundary of the Parish of Mahurangi aforesaid to the northern boundary of the Parish of Puhoi; again towards the North by part of the northern boundary of the Parish of Puhoi aforesaid to the north-western angle of allotment No. 116 of the Parish of Puhoi aforesaid; towards the North-east by the western boundary of allotment No. 116 last described to the Puhoi River and by said river to the sea; again towards the East by high water mark of the sea to the North Head of the Waiwera River; towards the South by the Waiwera River aforesaid and the northern boundary of the Wainui Highway District to the south-western angle of the Puhoi Block aforesaid; and again towards the West by the western boundary of the Parish of Puhoi to the place of commencement.

THE LOWER MAHURANGI HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Amended Boundaries.

Bounded towards the North by the southern boundary of the Upper Mahurangi District from the intersection of the last named boundary by the Great North Road to Hepburn's Creek in the Mahurangi Harbour; towards the East by the Mahurangi Harbour aforesaid from Hepburn's Creek to the North Head of the Puhoi River; towards the South by the Puhoi River aforesaid to the south-western angle of allotment No. 116 of the Parish of Puhoi; towards the West by the western boundary of allotment No. 116 of the Parish of Puhoi aforesaid to the southern boundary of the Parish of Mahurangi, and thence by parts of the southern and western boundaries of the Parish of Mahurangi aforesaid to the northern side of the road which forms the northern boundary of allotment No. 72 of the Parish of Mahurangi aforesaid; again towards the South by the northern side of said road continued westerly to the termination of a right line on the same in production in a northerly direction of the eastern boundary of allotment No. 13 of the Parish of Ahuroa; again towards the East by the right line

aforesaid by the eastern boundary of allotment No. 13 aforesaid and by said eastern boundary produced in a southerly direction to the centre of the Great North Road aforesaid, and thence by the centre of the Great North Road aforesaid to the road which forms the northern boundary of allotment No. 1 of the Parish of Ahuroa aforesaid and by the northern side of said road to the north-eastern boundary of allotment No. 2 of said parish, thence by the north-eastern boundary of allotment No. 2 last described to the south-eastern boundary of the Parish of Ahuroa aforesaid; again towards the South by part of the south-eastern boundary of the Parish of Ahuroa aforesaid to the south-western angle of said Parish; again towards the West by part of the south-western boundary of the Parish of Ahuroa aforesaid to the north-western angle of allotment No. 31 of said parish; and towards the North-west by the north-western boundary of allotment No. 31 aforesaid, the north-western and part of the north-eastern boundary of allotment No. 32 and the north-western boundary of allotment No. 29 to the north-eastern angle of the last named lot, thence by a right line crossing a road one hundred links wide to the line which forms the south-eastern boundary of allotment No. 18 by said last described boundary to the centre of the Great North Road and by the centre of the Great North Road aforesaid to the southern boundary of the Upper Mahurangi Highway District, the place of commencement.
