Conditions:—To provide in his house one private sitting room and six beds in not less than three bed rooms; to provide a shed for horses; to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle; to keep a proper supply of oats, to be furnished to travellers at a price not exceeding 6d. per quart; to provide and keep in repair a good stock-yard for cattle, and sheep-proof enclosure to hold not less than 1000 sheep; to keep a lamp with two burners, burning from sunset to sunrise, in a position sufficiently conspicuous to be seen from a distance all round; on all occasions to render every possible assistance to the police force, and to act as special constable.

William Dunford, Rakaia

Conditions:—To provide in his house a private sitting room and three separate bed rooms, with not less than ten beds; to provide stabling for six horses; to keep a supply of oats, and furnish the same to travellers at a charge not exceeding 6d. per quart measure; to provide and keep in repair a good stock-yard, and a sheep-proof enclosure to hold not less than 1000 sheep; not to keep a lamp burning at night outside his house; to afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers

to a safe fording across the river; to ferry police constables and prisoners in their charge over the river free of charge, and to act as special constable.

David Pollard, Pariora

Conditions:—To provide in his house one private sitting-room, and six beds in not less than three rooms; to provide a shed for six horses; to keep a proper supply of oats to be furnished to travellers at a price not exceeding 8d. per quart measure; to provide and keep in repair a good stockyard for cattle, and a sheep-proof enclosure to hold not less than 1000 sheep; to keep a proper lamp burning from sunset to sunrise, in such a position as to be conspicuous from a distance all around; on all occasions to render every assistance to the police force and to act as special constable.

**BOUNDARIES
OF THE NORTH CANTERBURY CENSUS DISTRICT
AND OF THE
SUB-DISTRICTS INTO WHICH IT IS SUBDIVIDED.**
North Canterbury District.

This district is bounded on the east by the sea, on the north by the northern boundary of the Province of Canterbury, on the west by the sea, on the south by the river Rangitata, from its mouth to the fork of the river above the gorge, thence by a direct line to the Abut Head, on the West Coast.

SUB-DISTRICTS.

1. Town of Christchurch Sub-District.

This district comprises the site of the town of Christchurch together with all the adjacent reserves lying between the said town and the rural sections fronting upon such reserves.

2. Town of Lyttelton Sub-District.

This district is bounded on the north by the summit of the range of hills on the north side of Lyttelton harbour, on the east and west by lines drawn due north and south through the easternmost and westernmost points respectively of the boundary of the said town as shown on the maps of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury in the land-office at Christchurch, and on the south by low water mark; including also the town reserves.

NOTE.—These boundaries are those assigned to the Town of Lyttelton District, in the Electoral Districts Act, 1858. They are more comprehensive than the boundaries assigned to this district under the last census.

3. Town of Kaiapoi Sub-District.

This district is bounded by a line commencing at the south-western corner of rural section No. 338 E, on the north road, thence south-westerly across the branch of the Courtenay (Waimakariri), and along the southern bank of the said branch (said to be the old course of the river), to a point in a line with the eastern boundary of rural section 365, thence in and along the line of the said eastern boundary of rural section 365, a distance of about 45 chains 80 links, thence easterly at a right angle about 66 chains 50 links along the southern side of a public street or road crossing rural sections 321, 468, and 297, to the northern bank of the main stream of the river Courtenay, following the said northern bank of the said main stream and the western bank of the branch stream, a distance altogether of about 64 chains, thence to the northward, crossing the branch stream, and meeting the line of the eastern side of Hall Street, continuing along the said eastern side of Hall Street, till it meets the northern side of Cass Street, following along the northern side of Cass Street, to a point on the southern boundary of rural section 338 E., about 13 chains from the south western corner of the said section, and returning along the southern boundary line of the said section, to the commencing point, and numbered and marked M.D. 14, on the maps setting out and describing the Mandeville district of the province of Canterbury in the Land Office, Christchurch.

NOTE.—The town of Kaiapoi has not appeared in any former census. It has been created by ordinance since the last census was taken, and it would therefore appear desirable that separate statistics should be obtained regarding it.

4. The Avon Sub-District.

This district comprises all that portion of the province bounded on the north by the south boundary of the Kaiapoi district, on the east by the sea coast, on the west by a line drawn due north and south through trig pole C 29, on the south bank of the river Courtenay, and on the south by the north bank of the river Avon, from its mouth to the point where it meets the boundary of the Town of Christchurch district, the boundary of that district as far as the south-east corner of rural section No. 10, by the south boundary of rural section No. 10, the south-east boundary of section No. 145, till it is crossed by a creek running easterly into the river Heathcote, thence along that creek till it meets a line in continuation of the south-eastern boundary line of section 180, following along that line to the south-east corner of section No. 180, the south boundaries of sections Nos. 180, 211, 240, 337, and 234, and the north side of the road on the south boundaries of those sections continued to the point where that road first meets a branch of the river Heathcote, and a straight line from that point due west, until it meets the west boundary of the district.

5. The Heathcote Sub-District.

This district comprises all that portion of the province bounded on the north by the Avon district and the town of Christchurch district, on the west by a line drawn due north and south through the trig pole C 29 before mentioned, on the south by the ridge of hills from the flagstaff on Mount Pleasant to the highest of the peaks called Cooper's Knobs, and by a straight line drawn from the last mentioned peak to the point where the river Halswell meets Lake Ellesmere, and by the north shore of that lake till it is met by the west boundary of the district; and on the east by a straight line from the flag-staff on Mount Pleasant to the point where the ferry road crosses the river Heathcote at the old ferry, and the shore and the estuary to its mouth.

6. Kaiapoi Country Sub-District.

This district comprises all that portion of the province of Canterbury bounded on the north by the south bank of the river Ashley, on the south by the south bank of the river Courtenay or Waimakariri, and a line drawn from trig pole C 19 on the south bank of that river, to trig pole C 27, on the sea coast, on the east by the sea coast, and on the west by a line drawn due north and south through trig pole C 29, on the south bank of the said river Courtenay, exclusive of the town of Kaiapoi district.

7. Lyttelton Country Sub-District.

This district comprises all that portion of the province included between the coasts of the sea, Lake Forsyth and Lake Ellesmere, the Akaroa district, and the western boundary of the Kaituna run No. 30, passing through trig pole L 7, and the Heathcote district, exclusive of the town of Lyttelton District.

8. Akaroa Sub-District.

This district comprises all that portion of the province included within the sea coast, and a line drawn from a point on the sea coast, half-way between the westernmost head of Pigeon Bay and the easternmost head of Port Albert (or Levy) southerly to the head of the Little River, and thence along that river and Lake Forsyth to the sea coast.

9. *Ashley Sub-District.*

This district comprises all that portion of the province lying north of the south bank of the river Waiaimakariri, and of a direct line from the source of that river to the mouth of the river Brunner or Arahura, exclusive of the Kaiapoi Town and Country districts.

10. *Malvern Sub-District.*

This district comprises all that portion of the province bounded on the north by the Ashley district, on the east by the Avon, Heathcote and Lyttelton Country Districts, and the sea coast, on the west by the sea coast, and on the south by the north bank of the Rakaia river, from the mouth to the first fork of the river above the gorge, thence

by a direct line to Bold Head or Parimata, on the West Coast.

11.—*Ashburton Sub-District.*

This district comprises all that portion of the province lying between the Malvern District and the southern boundary of the General Census District, between the Hurunui and the Rangitata.

N.B.—The above districts are nearly coterminous with those for provincial elections and for the last census taken under the Provincial Census Ordinance. The exceptions are the cases of Lyttelton and Kaiapoi noticed above, and the Pastoral Districts; in the latter cases an alteration is required, a portion only of the province being included in the sub-division.
