ADDRESS OF HIS HONOR THE SUPER-
INTENDENT ON PROROGUING
THE PROVINCIAL COUNCIL, ON
TUESDAY THE 3rd JANUARY, 1860.

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the
Provincial Council.—

The business of the session being
concluded, I have to express to you
my thanks for the great diligence you
have exerted in arranging the proceed-
ings for the financial year, and passing
the various necessary laws submitted
for your consideration and approval.

During your present session I have
already on the part of His Excellency
the Governor assented to—

The Loan Amendment Ordinance ;
The Lunatic Asylum and Gravel-pit
Reserves Sale Ordinance ;
The Roads Diversion Ordinance ;
The Cathedral Square Ordinance
Amendment Ordinance ;
The Public Hospital Ordinance ;
The Church Property Trust Amend-
ment Ordinance ;

The Race Course Lease Ordinance ;
and the Shipbuilding Reserve Lease
Ordinance.

I have further to publish my assent
on the part of His Excellency the
Governor to

The Cattle Trespass Amendment
Ordinance ;

The Sheep Ordinance Amendment
Ordinance ;

The Municipal Council Ordinance ;
and

The Appropriation Ordinance.

The bills which I have reserved for
His Excellency's assent are—

The Peacock Wharf Extension Or-
dinance ;

The Lyttleton and Christchurch
Railway Ordinance ; and

The Loan Ordinance.

The supplies you have voted will be
used in conformity with your wishes.

I will endeavour by all means in my
power to promote the most important
advantages intended for the colony by
your legislation on the subject of rail-

way communication between the port town and producing districts of this province.

It is my attention shortly to call you together again. Circumstances may arise out of the various works you have authorized which may render such a course necessary. Meanwhile there are many indications that the temporary pressure which our commerce has had to contend with is rapidly passing away, and I therefore hope soon to congratulate you upon a perfect restoration of prosperity, and that at our next meeting the then state of our province will justify me in recommending a vigorous prosecution of such ordinary public works as remain to be carried out in order to open up and develop the resources of the country.

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen, I now declare this Council prorogued until the 29th day of June next.
