I have to thank you for the alacrity with which you have responded to my call for your assistance, and to state that I shall use every effort to procure a realization of your determination regarding the railway.

The "Lyttelton and Christchurch Railway Loan Bill" and the "Lunatic Asylum and Gravel Pit Reserves Sales Bill," I have the honor to reserve for the assent of his Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS, by an Act bearing date the 6th day of August, 1856, passed by the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the consent of

the General Assembly, intituled "An Act to make provision for the performance of the duties of the Superintendent during the temporary absence of any such Superintendent, and during vacancies in the office."
