I, CHARLES BOWEN, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in virtue of the powers vested in me by the 43rd clause of the Waste Lands Regulations now in force within the said province, do hereby reserve from sale the portions of land hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Six hundred and forty acres, more or less, for a township at Wairewa, Little River, bounded on the north by the native reserve, and a line in continuation of the southern boundary of the said reserve, 24 chains westerly and 60 chains easterly; on the east and west by lines at right angles to the northern boundary line, and on the south by a road and the Little River and the eastern branch thereof.
