PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, in New Zealand, intituled the "Trespass of Cattle Ordinance, Session XIV, No. 1," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent to cause Public Pounds to be erected and maintained within the said Province; and whereas, by the "Superintendent's Deputy Act, 1856," the said Superintendent has appointed Robert Wilkin, Esq., to be Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province. Now therefore, I, Robert Wilkin, Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the provisions of the above recited Ordinance and Act, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the place or enclosure, situated in the Town of Akaroa, at the southeast corner of Reserve No. 114, on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the said Province, shall be deemed and be taken to be a Public Pound within the meaning of the above recited Ordinance.

BARQUE "MERSEY."

The master and surgeon appear to have carefully performed their duties. The matron to have been attentive, and to have kept the single women in good order.

No. 251, in red.—Timaru Race-course.

No. 252, in red.—20 acres, more or less, situate in the Ashley district, bounded on the north-west by road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section 4599; on the eastward by Road and Railway Reserve, extending southerly between the two before mentioned boundaries from their junction so as to include the above quantity.

No. 253, in red.—28 acres, more or less, situate in the Ashley district, bounded on the north-west by the main line of road, between Marshman's Road and the Upper Sefton Road; on the north-east by a road south-west of and adjoining Section 2779; on the south-west by Section 3796; and on the south-east by Section 3865.

No. 254, in red.—13 acres, more or less, situate in the Ashley district, situate west of the Terrace, and between Sections 2083 and 2726, adjoining Reserve No. 201, in red.
