ADDRESS OF HIS HONOR THE
SUPERINTENDENT

*On Proroguing the Provincial Council, on
Wednesday, December 3rd, 1862.*

MR. SPEAKER AND GENTLEMEN OF THE
COUNCIL,—

IN accordance with the powers conferred upon me by the Constitution Act, I have now to prorogue this Council; but before closing this session, let me express my acknowledgments for your cordial co-operation with me in the transaction of the business which I have had the pleasure of submitting to you.

The supplies which you have voted for the Public Service of the Province shall be administered with every care and prudence that a sound economy requires.

It may be considered a matter of regret that no decided action has been taken in Education, and that the subject has been again deferred; but if delay will lead to a more thorough sifting of the question, and thereby produce measures more generally acceptable with the public at large, I shall no doubt, in common with many others, cease to regret that such delay has taken place.

Measures have been taken to ascertain the traffic returns between Lyttelton and Christ-

church, and I have every reason to believe that the information which induced you to express an opinion in favour of the construction of the railway to Ferrymead will prove to be substantially correct.

I have now to declare my assent to the following measures passed by you, and which have received my consideration, namely:—

Gloucester Street, both sides, from Madras Street to Madras Street in Latimer Square.

Worcester Street, both sides, from Manchester Street to Madras Street.

Kilmore Street, both sides, from Papanui Road to Manchester Street.

St. Asaph Street, both sides, from Manchester Street to Sumner Road.

Sumner Road, both sides, from Town Hall to St. Asaph Street, west side.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it was provided that the Governor in Council might, by warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the said Colony, all or any of the Powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he might think fit, and might from time to time receive such delegation: And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to William Sefton Moorhouse, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, the several powers vested in the said Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded, as in the said Act provided, and subject to the Regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made. Now therefore I, William Sefton Moorhouse, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare:—

1. That after the date hereof, the several Colonies of Australia, that is to say, the Colony of Victoria, of New South Wales, of Queensland, of South Australia and Western Australia, as well as the Colony of Tasmania, and the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be deemed to be, for the purposes of the above-recited Act, infected districts within the meaning of the said Act, and that no cattle shall be allowed to be imported from the above-mentioned districts, and that in the case where any cattle may be imported from the said districts, such cattle shall be destroyed forthwith, in such manner and at such places as the Superintendent may proclaim and appoint.

2. That after the date of these regulations

the Provinces of Otago and Southland, in the Colony of New Zealand, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning of the said Act, and that no cattle shall be imported from the said Provinces, either by land or sea.

3. That the following persons shall be appointed Inspectors, under the second section of the said Act :—

REGULATIONS

Under which Licenses will be issued to Cut Timber in the Maori Bush at Kaiapoi.

1. No part of a section of bush to be sold until it has been sub-divided among the several native owners to whom it was allotted by Mr. Buller. Any dispute with respect to this sub-division to be decided by the voice of the majority of those owners, subject to an appeal to the Runanga.

2. Native owners under 18 years of age will not be allowed to sell their bush.

3. A guardian shall not under any circumstances be allowed to sell a piece of bush allotted to his ward.

4. No piece of bush belonging to a non-resident native may be sold without his written consent.

5. The person applying for a license must be a person of good character, to be approved of by the Resident Magistrate.

6. The price agreed to be paid to the native owner must be a fair and sufficient one.

7. No European, whether licensed or not, may reside on the Maori Reserve.

8. Licensees desirous of employing other Europeans to cut timber for them, must send in the names of such persons to the Sub-Inspector of Police at Kaiapoi.

9. The timber to be all cleared away within two years from the date of the license.

10. A license to be immediately forfeited if the holder thereof, or any person employed by him, shall be found to have given or supplied spirits to any natives, or to have been guilty of any other misconduct which may cause serious trouble with the natives.
