CONDITIONS.

WILLIAM WEEDEN, "Half-way House,"
Great South Road.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and two private sitting-rooms.
2. To provide not less than twenty beds for travellers, in not less than twelve separate bed-rooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least twelve horses.
4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle, and to provide, in a convenient position, a proper trough for watering cattle.
5. To keep at all times a proper supply of oats and *oaten* or *grass* hay. Oats to be charged for to travellers at not more than 6d. per quart, and to be always served out with the authorized quart measure.
6. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient stockyard for cattle, containing a superficial area of not less than 225 square yards. For the occupation of this yard during the night, the licensee may make a charge at rates not exceeding the following, viz.:—Twopence per head for all cattle under 50 in number, and one penny per head for all over that number.
7. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof yard, containing a superficial area of not less than 900 square yards; or, at the option of the licensee, to keep one acre of land enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence. For the occupation of this yard or paddock during the night, the licensee may make a charge at rates not exceeding the following, viz.:—Sixpence per score for all sheep under 300 in number, fourpence per score for all over that

number and under 500, and twopence per score for all over 500.

8. To keep a lamp burning with two burners from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as to be conspicuous from a distance all round the house.
9. To be sworn in and to act as a Constable, especially when required by the Magistrates or the Police.
10. On all occasions to render every assistance, and to supply information to Magistrates, and to the Police in the execution of their duty.
11. To keep a clean and orderly house, and to render it as comfortable for the accommodation of travellers as the circumstances of position and distance from towns will fairly allow.
12. Nil.
13. The license to be cancelled by order of any three Justices of the Peace, if it be proved to their satisfaction that any of the conditions of the license are not regularly fulfilled, or if any drunkenness be proved to have been allowed on the premises, or if any spirits shall be supplied from the house or premises to any Aboriginal Native of New Zealand.
14. A printed or fairly written copy of these conditions, and a tariff of all charges to be kept at all times posted up in some conspicuous place in the tap-room, and in all the sitting-rooms, for the information of travellers.
15. To provide a Visitors' Book, which shall be kept in the custody of the licensee, but whenever asked for shall be produced to visitors and lodgers, for the insertion of any remark on the accommodation or attendance; a notice to this effect to be kept posted in the same manner as the Tariff of Charges. The book to be open at all times to inspection by Magistrates or the Police, and to be sent to the Clerk of the Bench, at Christchurch, a week before the Annual Licensing Meeting, for the purpose of being produced at that meeting.

AUKLAND, JOHN, and GILL, JOHN,
River Hinds. "Aukland and Gill's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in their house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.
2. To provide not less than eight beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed-rooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least eight horses.
4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle.
- 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11. Same as Weeden's.

16. This license not to take effect until it has been endorsed by an Officer of

Police, to the effect that all the conditions have been complied with.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.
2. To provide not less than eight beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed-rooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle.

BROWN, JOHN ELLSON, the Rakaia River, South Bank. "Brown's Accommodation House."

2. To provide not less than sixteen beds for travellers, in not less than eight separate bed-rooms.

To provide and keep in repair two good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof yards, containing a superficial area of not less than 900 square yards each; or, at the option of the licensee, to keep two acres of land, each enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence. For the occupation of these yards or paddocks during the night, the licensee may make a charge at rates not exceeding the following, viz.:—Sixpence per score for all sheep under 300 in number; fourpence per score for all over that number and under 500; and twopence per score for all over 500.
8. To keep a lamp burning with two burners from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as not to be visible from the north bank of the Rakaia.

12. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.

16. To keep in repair and work ferry signals to the satisfaction of the Provincial Engineer.

BURGESS, JOHN, Burke's Pass. "Burgess' Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public sitting-room.
2. To provide not less than eight beds

for travellers, in not less than two separate bed-rooms.

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle.

BUTTERWORTH, WILLIAM, Oparua River. "Butterworth's Accommodation House."

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle.

CAMERON, DONALD and DUNCAN, Saltwater Creek. "Cameron's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in their house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.
2. To provide not less than fifteen beds for travellers, in not less than seven separate bed-rooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least twelve horses.
4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle.
- 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11. Same as Weeden's.
12. To keep at all times a safe ferry boat, in good working order, and ready for the conveyance of passengers across the Saltwater Creek, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in summer and winter. The fares to be as follows:—For foot passengers, one penny each, between the hours above named; the fares to be doubled at all other times, Officers of the Supreme Court, Magistrates, and Police Constables on duty, and Prisoners to be ferried free of charge. To afford every assistance in their power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the Saltwater Creek.

COOK, REUBEN, Coal Track, "Cook's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answer-

ing as such, one public and one private sitting-room.

2. To provide not less than six beds for travellers, in not less than three separate bed-rooms.

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.

FLOWERS, CHARLES, and ROBSON, MATHEW, the Rakaia River. "Dunford's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in their house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and two private sitting-rooms; also to provide a separate room, and special and proper accommodation for female travellers.

2. To provide not less than twenty beds

for travellers, in not less than twelve separate bed-rooms.

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least twenty horses.

4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for all horses and cattle.

5. Same as Weeden's.

6. To provide and keep in repair two good and sufficient stock-yards for cattle, containing a superficial area of not less than 225 square yards each. For the occupation of these yards during the night, the licensees may make a charge at rates not exceeding the following, viz.:—Twopence per head for all cattle under 50 in number, and one penny per head for all over that number.

7. To provide and keep in repair two good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof yards, containing a superficial area of not less than 900 square yards each, or, at the option of the licensees, to keep two acres of land, each enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence. For the occupation of these yards or paddocks during the night, the licensees may make a charge at rates not exceeding the following, viz.:—Sixpence per score for all sheep under 300 in number, fourpence per score for all over that number and under 500, and twopence per score for all over 500.

8. Not to keep a lamp burning at night outside the house.

12. Conditions regarding the ferry over the Rakaia to stand as per special agreement with the Provincial Government, dated 19th July, 1860, and especially the licensees shall keep a ferry boat or boats to be used upon the River Rakaia, the gear and all necessary fittings to render the same serviceable, to be always maintained in good order and repair. The licensees shall at all reasonable times and hours cross passengers, stock, and other goods at the prices named below:—Pedestrians, each, 1s.; horse-men, 2s. 6d.; drays and other vehicles, 5s.; merchandize, per ton, 10s.; wool, per bale, 1s. Officers of the Supreme Court, Magistrates, and Police Constables on duty and Prisoners, to be ferried free of charge. To afford every assistance in their power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.

16. To keep in repair and work ferry signals to the satisfaction of the Provincial Engineer.

17. Bound to cross sheep at threepence per head so long as the ferry is continued to them by the Government.

FORSTER, WILLIAM, Governor's Bay. "Forster's Accommodation House."

- besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.
2. To provide not less than six beds for travellers, in not less than three separate bed-rooms.

- TURTON, WILLIAM**, River Ashburton. "The Ashburton Accommodation House."

 2. To provide not less than twenty beds for travellers, in not less than six separate bed-rooms.
 3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least twenty horses.
 4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle.

 6. To provide and keep in repair two good and sufficient stock-yards for cattle, containing a superficial area of not less than 225 square yards each. For the occupation of these yards during the night, the licensee may make a charge at rates not exceeding the following, viz.:—Twopence per head for all cattle under 50 in number, and one penny per head for all over that number.

To provide and keep in repair two good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof yards, containing a superficial area of not less than 900 square yards each, or, at the option of the licensee, to keep two acres of land, each enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence. For the occupation of these yards or paddocks during the night, the licensee may make a charge at rates not exceeding the following, viz.:—Sixpence per score for all sheep under 300 in number; fourpence per score for all over that number and

under 500; and twopence per score for all over 500.

8. To keep a lamp burning with two burners from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as not to be visible on the South bank of the Ashburton.

If required, to accompany foot passengers and horsemen across the river, at a charge not exceeding sixpence each for horseman and persons driving drays or vehicles, at a charge not exceeding one shilling for each dray or vehicle. Officers of the Supreme Court, Magistrates, and Police Constables on duty, and Prisoners to be put across free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.

TYLER and BROWN, River Waitangi.
"Tyler and Brown's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in their house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.

2. To provide not less than eight beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bedrooms.

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.

4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle.

5, 6, 7. Same as Weeden's.

8. To keep a lamp burning with two burners from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so placed as not to be visible from the South bank of the River Waitangi.

9, 10, 11. Same as Weeden's.

12. To keep at all times a safe ferry boat (punt) in good working order, ready for the conveyance of passengers across the Waitangi, between the hours of 5 a.m. and 7 p.m. in summer, and between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. in the winter. The fares to be as follows:—For foot passengers, two shillings each, between the hours above named; the fares to be doubled at all other times. For sheep, 3d. per head; for horsemen, 5s.; for drays and other vehicles, 10s.; for merchandise, per ton, 20s.; for wool, per bale, 2s.; summer to imply from 1st October to 31st March. Officers of the Supreme Court, Magistrates, and Police Constables on duty, and Prisoners, to be ferried free of charge. To afford every assistance in their power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.

WHITE, CHARLES, Waimakariri River.
"White's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good

repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.

2. To provide not less than ten beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed-rooms.

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.

4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle.

5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11. Same as Weeden's.

12. To keep at all times a horse for conveyance of passengers across the Waimakariri between the hours of daylight in summer and winter. The fares to be at a moderate charge. Officers of the Supreme Court, Magistrates, and Police Constables on duty and prisoners to be put across free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.

YOUNG, JOHN ALBERT, Arrowhenua.
"The Arrowhenua Hotel."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.

2. To provide not less than twelve beds for travellers, in not less than five separate bed-rooms.

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.

4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle.

5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11. Same as Weeden's.

12. To keep at all times a safe ferry boat (punt) in good working order, and ready for conveyance of passengers across the Arrowhenua between the hours of sunrise and sunset, the fares to be as follows:—For foot-passengers, sixpence between the hours above-named, when punt can be worked by a rope, and one shilling when the rope cannot be used; for every horse, two shillings. Officers of the Supreme Court, Magistrates and Police Constables on duty and Prisoners to be ferried free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river. To keep a fairly-written copy of the charges posted in some conspicuous place.
