PROCLAMATION.

UNDER "DISEASED CATTLE ACT, 1861."

WHEREAS, by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it was provided that the Governor in Council might, by warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the said Colony, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he might think fit, and might from time to time rescind such delegation. And whereas the said Governor, hath with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to SAMUEL BEALEY, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, the several powers vested in the said Governor by the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Seventh, Ninth, and Tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the Fifteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made.

Now, therefore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare, that from and after the Second day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty four, the Province of Wellington in the Colony of New Zealand, shall be deemed to be an infected district within the meaning of the said Act, and that no cattle shall be imported into the Province of Canterbury from the said Province.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by a certain Ordinance passed by the Lieutenant Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Ordinance to provide for the establishment and maintenance of a Constabulary Force," it is (amongst other things) enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor to cause a sufficient number of fit and able men, to be embodied to serve as an armed Police Force, who shall be sworn before a Justice of the Peace, to act as Constables in and throughout the Colony, for preserving the peace, and preventing robberies and other felonies, and apprehending offenders against the peace; and that it shall also be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, by warrant under his hand, to appoint Commissioners and Inspectors of such Police Force, or such other Officers as he may deem expedient for the general superintendance and management of the said Force; and such Commissioners, Inspectors, and other Officers, from time to time, to displace and remove and to appoint others in their place

as to him shall seem meet, and that it shall also be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, from time to time, to make such regulations respecting the training, arms, and accoutrements, clothing and equipments of such Force, and respecting all other matters connected therewith, as may be required for promoting the discipline and efficiency thereof; and also to direct the employment and distribution of the said Force, as to him shall seem meet. And whereas by a certain Ordinance passed by the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, with the advice and consent of the Council thereof, intituled, "The Empowering Ordinance, Session II, No. 2," that all such powers as are, by the several Ordinances recited in the Schedule to this Ordinance, conferred on the Governor-in-Chief, Lieutenant-Governors, or Governors of New Zealand, or on the Lieutenant-Governor of New Munster, or on the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony or Province for the time being, are hereby within the limits of the Province of Canterbury conferred on the Superintendent thereof; and whereas in the Schedule to the last recited Ordinance is comprised the said firstly recited Ordinance; and whereas it is expedient that an armed Police Force should be created for the said Province of Canterbury, and that a Commissioner and Inspectors and other Officers should be appointed, and that regulations should be made respecting such armed Police Force. Now I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province of Canterbury, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby direct that an armed Police Force, shall be embodied to act as Constables within the said Province of Canterbury, and that such armed Police Force shall consist of thirty-eight men, and be composed of one Commissioner, one Inspector, and thirty-six non-commissioned Officers and Privates, and I do further hereby direct that the general superintendence and management of the said Force shall be vested in the said Commissioner, and that it shall be the duty of the said Commissioner from time to time to engage and appoint all such non-commissioned Officers and Privates as shall be required for the said Force.
