PROCLAMATION.

UNDER "DISEASED CATTLE ACT, 1861."

WHEREAS, by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it was provided that the Governor in Council might, by warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the said Colony, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such Regulations as he might think fit, and might from time to time rescind such delegation. And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to SAMUEL BEALEY, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, the several powers vested in the said Governor by the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Seventh, Ninth, and Tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the Regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the Fifteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and to any other Regulations to be from time to time duly made: And whereas it has been made to appear to me as such Superintendent as aforesaid, that the disease called "Pleuro-pneumonia," being an infectious, or contagious disease, has broken out amongst cattle within the several districts hereinafter described:

Now therefore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare that the District comprising the several Provinces of

Otago, Southland, Nelson, and Marlborough in the Middle Island, and the District comprising the several Provinces of Auckland, Taranaki, Hawke's Bay, and Wellington in the North Island, are infected within the meaning of the said Act, and that from and after Monday the Fourth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, no cattle shall be imported from the said Districts into the Province of Canterbury, and I do further proclaim and declare the following Regulations for the destruction of diseased cattle, and for the preventing the removal or transportation of cattle from the said several infected Districts into the Province of Canterbury.

- I. If any person shall drive or remove, or cause to be driven or removed, or assist in driving or removing any cattle from either of the said infected districts into the Province of Canterbury, such person shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty Pounds for every head of cattle so driven into the Province of Canterbury.
- II. It shall be lawful for any Inspector of Cattle or Police Constable to destroy or cause to be destroyed any cattle which shall pass into this Province from either of the said districts.
- III. If any person shall wilfully impede or obstruct any Inspector or any Police Constable acting under the authority of these Regulations, every person so offending shall and may be seized and detained by such person so acting as aforesaid, or any person or persons he may call to his assistance, until such offender or offenders

can be taken before two Justices of the Peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty Pounds.

HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that the following Reserves, made by him temporarily under the 19th clause of the Waste Land Regulations, have been confirmed by the Provincial Council; viz. :—

No. 286, in red.—Fifty acres, more or less, situate at the Gorge of the Waitohi River—for the purposes of a Government depôt.

No. 297, in red.—Reserve for a line of tramway, one chain wide, branching from the Little River tramway at a point on the Taitapu, near Trig. station 2 L; passing along the northern shore of Lake Ellesmere, between the high and low water mark, to a point near Trig. station E 11; thence following a line passing by the south-western corner of section No. 6486, to the Railway station on the north bank of the Rakaiia, subject to sections 6371, 5787, and 6073.

Also a branch of the same, commencing at a point on the first described line, the same being the south-eastern side of Beetham's-road, and running south-east to the deep-water landing place at Birdling's Creek.

No. 298, in red.—Four acres, being a rectangular block of land, having frontage of five chains, to the south-eastern boulevard of the town of Ashburton, and extending back north-westerly in a rectangular block a distance of ten chains, between Kermode-street and Dobson-street; subject nevertheless to the road one chain wide, leading to the mouth of the River Ashburton, passing through

this reserve, for which road, allowance is made in the acreage—for a cemetery.

No. 299, in red.—One acre, two roods, twenty-six perches, bounded on the north-east by Dobson-street, on the south-east by West-street, and on the westward by the high bank of the River Ashburton—for railway purposes.

No. 300, in red.—Seven acres, three roods, fourteen perches, bounded on the north-west by East-street, on the north-east by South-street, on the eastward by another street, and on the south-east by the high bank of the River Ashburton—for railway purposes.

No. 301, in red.—One acre, bounded on the north-east by South-street, on the westward by the street separating this Reserve from Reserve No. 300, and on the south-east by Cass-street—for purposes of the Provincial Government.

No. 302, in red.—A tract of land for a line of tramway, one chain wide, commencing at a point on the reserve for a tramway, No. 297, in red, on the northern shore of Lake Ellesmere at L 1 Creek; thence following a line in a north-westerly direction to the south-eastern corner of section No. 3226; thence following a line to the junction of Maddison's-road with the road to the Selwyn, and from thence joining the South Railway, at the north-western corner of section 5717, with a branch also adjoining the said railway at a point about ninety chains, south-west of the north-western corner of the before-mentioned section No. 5717, subject to section 6638—for a tramway.

No. 303, in red.—A tract of land, one chain wide, commencing at a point on the South Railway where it is crossed by the Selwyn and Bealey's-road; thence following a line, in a south-easterly direction, to the junction of Cryer's-road and the Tau-mutu and Bridge's-road, with Fereday's-road; a branch from this reserve joins the tramway reserve, No. 297, in red, at a point, being about 175 chains west of Trig. station E 14—for a tramway.

No. 304, in red.—Thirty acres, situate in the Ellesmere District, commencing at a point on the north-west side of the road passing through section No. 5787, the same being fifteen chains north-east of the north-eastern corner of section No. 6073; following along that road, in a north-easterly direction, a distance of fifteen chains, and extending back north-westerly a distance of twenty-chains, in a rectangular block—for a gravel-pit.
