A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of certain Persons.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c.

WHEREAS, by "The Naturalization Act, 1863," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act, by any proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such proclamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be, and to have been, from such specified time, a natural-born subject of Her Majesty, within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every

such proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act from the dates hereinafter specified, viz:—

CHARLES WANEN,

from the Second day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, native of Sweden, Master Mariner; residence—Lyttelton, in the Province of Canterbury.

CHARLES LEWERSON,

from the Second day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, native of Denmark, Master Mariner; residence—Lyttelton, in the Province of Canterbury.

CHARLES E. MELANDER,

from the Second day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, native of Sweden, Master Mariner; residence,—Lyttelton, in the Province of Canterbury.
