SHIP "IVANHOE."

June 13.

THE Commissioners visited the vessel at the Heads. Twenty-five deaths were reported, several being from low fever.

Messrs. Donald and Rouse went on board; there was no case of recent illness; three or four convalescents. The ship generally was very dirty; an unwholesome damp smell pervading every part. On the main deck a sheep pen cargo, the drainage from which ran over the deck. The between decks damp and dark; insufficient light and ventilation.

It was decided by the Board of Health to detain the vessel in quarantine, to allow of cleaning, lime washing, and washing clothes, to avoid all danger of infection.

June 20.

The Commissioners again visited the ship, the immigrants having been removed to Camp Bay, and the vessel admitted to pratique. The arrangements of the vessel were far inferior to those of any of the late Provincial Government ships. There was a deficiency of deck lights and scuttles, also of ventilating arrangements. The hospitals imperfectly constructed; bulk heads of slight material. The isolation of the single women's compartment incomplete. No provision for bathing in any section. The decks excessively damp throughout. The bunks in many cases under six feet in length.

The cook-house on deck was very complete and satisfactory. The distilling apparatus (Normanby's) was efficient.

June 22.

The Commissioners visited the immigrants in Camp Bay. All concur in expressing deep obligation to the Medical Officer for his care and skill. The immigrants all state that the damp of the ship and consequent dirt was bad or worse at embarkation, owing to the effect of a previous cargo of sugar and molasses.

The supplies generally have given satisfaction, some casks of beef excepted. The provision of lights stated to have been insufficient.

The Commissioners recommend that the surgeon receive his gratuity. They regret that they cannot recommend that the captain or third officer receive gratuities. The matron appears to have performed her duties satisfactorily.

GEORGE HENRY GIGGS.

SELWYN HOTEL.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house besides the tap-room, or room answering as such, one public and two private sitting rooms.
2. To provide not less than 25 beds for travellers, in not less than 15 separate bedrooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight and fit for the accommodation of at least 12 horses.
4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle, and to provide, in a convenient position, a proper trough for watering cattle.
5. To keep at all times a proper supply of oats and eaten, or grass hay. Oats to be charged for to travellers at not more than 6d. per quart, and to be always served out with the authorised quart measure.
6. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient stockyard for cattle, containing a superficial area of not less than 225 square yards. For the occupation of this yard during the night, the licensee may make a charge at rates not exceeding the follow-

ing, viz. :—Twopence per head for all cattle under 50 in number, and one penny per head for all over that number.

7. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof yard, containing a superficial area of not less than 900 square yards; or at the option of the licensee, to keep one acre of land enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence. For the occupation of this yard or paddock during the night, the licensee may make a charge at rates not exceeding the following, viz. : Sixpence per score for all sheep under 300 in number, fourpence per score for all over that number and under 500, and twopence per score for all over 500.

8. To keep a lamp, burning with two burners, from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as to be conspicuous from a distance all round the house.

9. To be sworn in and act as a constable, especially when required by the magistrates or the police.

10. On all occasions to render every assistance and to supply information to magistrates and to the police in the execution of their duty.

11. To keep a clean and orderly house, and to render it as comfortable for the accommodation of travellers as the circumstances of position and distance from towns will fairly allow.

12. Nil.

13. The license to be cancelled by order of any three Justices of the Peace, if it be proved to their satisfaction that any of the conditions of the license are not regularly fulfilled, or if any drunkenness be proved to have been allowed on the premises, or if any spirits shall be supplied from the house or premises to any Aboriginal Native of New Zealand.

14. A printed or fairly written copy of these conditions and a tariff of all charges to be kept at all times posted up in some conspicuous place in the tap-room, and in all the sitting-rooms, for the information of travellers.

15. To provide a Visitors' Book, which shall be kept in the custody of the licensee, but whenever asked for shall be produced to visitors and lodgers for the insertion of any remark on the accommodation or attendance; a notice to this effect to be kept posted in the same manner as the Tariff of Charges. The book to be open at all times to inspection by magistrates or the police, and to be sent to the Clerk of the Bench, at Christchurch, a week before the Annual Licensing Meeting, for the purpose of being produced at that meeting.
