No. 317, in red.—All that tract of land, being a strip of land half a mile wide, as marked on the plan of the Railway Commissioners, and coloured green thereon, dated 6th February, 1864, extending from the thirty-first mile peg to section No. 5800.

No. 318, in red.—All that tract of land, being half a mile wide, on each side

of the present railway reserve, as marked on the plan of the Railway Commissioners, dated 6th February, 1864, extending from the northern bank of the Ashburton to the southern bank of the Orari.

- No. 319, in red.—All that tract of land, being half a mile wide, on each side of the present railway reserve, as marked on the plan of the Railway Commissioners, dated 6th February, 1864, extending from the northern bank of the Otaio to the northern bank of the Waitangi.
- No. 349, in red.—All that tract of land, one mile wide, lying between the River Rangitata and the Arowhenua township, the centre line of the same being a right line drawn from a point on the northern bank of the Rangitata aforesaid, one mile above McDonald's crossing, to a point on the western side of the south railway reserve, about thirty chains to the southward of Trig. Station 4 (save and except the freehold), as the same is more particularly delineated on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury, setting out and describing the rural land in the Timaru district.
- No. 350, in red.—All that tract of land, one mile wide, lying between the Rivers Ashburton and Rangitata, the centre line of the same being a right line drawn from the south-western corner of section 4354, on the South Road, to a point on the northern bank of the Rangitata aforesaid, one mile above McDonald's crossing (save and except the freehold land and the reserve for railway purposes numbered 318, in red), as the same is more particularly delineated and described on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury, setting out and describing the runs between the Rivers Ashburton and Rangitata before mentioned—for the purposes of the construction of a Railway, from Christchurch to the Waitangi.

- No. 369, in red.—All that piece or parcel of land in the Christchurch District, three chains wide, extending from the road, on the north-west side of section 1765, to the road along the

south-eastern bank of the Waimakariri as marked on the plans, Nos. 1 and 3, dated respectively 30th August, and 13th September, 1864, signed by the Chairman of the Railway and Bridge Commission.

- No. 370, in red.—All that piece or parcel of land, in the Mandeville District, three chains wide extending from the north-west boundary of section 4295, to the south-western boundary of section 317, as marked on plan No. 3 of the Railway and Bridge Commission, dated 13th September, 1864—subject to sections 5736, and 6676.
- No. 371, in red.—All that piece or parcel of land in the Mandeville District, three chains wide, extending from the northern boundary of section 437 to the southern boundary of section 6692, as marked on plan No. 3, of the Railway and Bridge Commission, dated 13th September, 1864—for the purposes of the construction of a Railway, from Christchurch to the Hurunui.

PILOT REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall be deemed a pilot unless he be duly licensed by the Marine Board.
2. Every pilot shall carry his license with him, and shall produce it to the master of any ship or vessel on its being demanded.
3. Any master requiring a pilot to conduct his vessel to sea, must make an application at the Harbour Master's office twenty-four hours previous to sailing.
4. The rate of pilotage into or out of the Port of Lyttelton, from, or to the distance of one league from the pilot station (Little Port Cooper) shall be four-pence per ton register.

5. Any master who shall make a signal for a pilot, or cause a pilot to be sent for to take his vessel to sea, and shall not within 12 hours of the time of arrival of the pilot on board such vessel, proceed to sea, shall pay a sum at the rate of One Pound per day, for every day such pilot may be detained on board such vessel, in addition to the regular pilotage.

6. Every pilot detained on board a vessel longer than forty-eight hours, whether by stress of weather, quarantine, or otherwise, is to be paid eight shillings per day, in addition to the regular pilotage.

7. Pilots refusing or neglecting their duty to forfeit a sum not exceeding fifty pounds.

WATERMEN'S REGULATIONS.

1. All carters, porters, and watermen engaged upon the public wharfs to be under the control of the Port Officer.

2. Any boatman carrying passengers for hire, without a license, to the shipping, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

3. Every waterman shall upon payment of One Pound per annum, in respect of every boat to be plied by him, receive a license to be renewed on the 1st July in each year.

4. No boat shall be allowed to remain at any landing place after discharging her cargo and passengers, or to make fast to any steps, or handrails belonging thereto, without some person in charge ready to remove the said boat when required to do so by the Port Officer, or person deputed by him.

5. A board exhibiting the authorized charges from sunrise to sunset, shall be placed near the landing-place; after sunset, and when the blue flag shall be hoisted half-mast by the Harbour Master, or person deputed by him, denoting bad weather, double fares can be demanded by the waterman.

6. Any boatman resisting, impeding, or obstructing the Harbour Master, Pilot, or other person deputed by either of them in the execution of his duty, or using threatening or abusive language to them, or any of them, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding fifty pounds.

7. The number of passengers allowed to be carried as specified in each license shall be legibly painted on some conspicuous part of the boat in respect of which such license is issued, and should any boatman convey a larger number of passengers, or a greater quantity of luggage, than is allowed in his license, he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty pounds.

9. Each boat shall carry if required 8 lbs weight of luggage with every passenger, without additional charge, and any passenger detaining a boat alongside any vessel for a period exceeding twenty minutes, shall be liable to an extra charge at the rate of four shillings per hour.

BALLAST LIGHTERS.

10. All ballast lighters, cargo and water tank boats plying for hire shall be measured, marked, and registered, and upon payment of three shillings per ton measurement shall receive a license to be renewed on the 1st July in each year.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Regulations respecting Delegation of Powers to Superintendents under "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."

At the Government House, at Auckland, the Fourteenth day of September, 1864.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Warrants under the hand of his Excellency the Governor, bearing date this Fourteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Governor has, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to the Superintendents respectively of the Provinces of Auckland, Taranaki, Wellington, Hawke's Bay, Nelson, Marlborough, Canterbury, Otago and Southland, certain powers conferred on him by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," subject to certain Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council under the said recited Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, by virtue of the authority given to him by the 14th Section of the above recited Act, doth hereby make and ordain the following Regulations:—

1. The delegation of powers under the said warrants shall continue to be in force for the period of one year from this date, subject to be rescinded according to the provisions of the above recited Act.

2. Each Superintendent shall, immediately

after exercising any of the delegated powers, notify the same to the Governor, and he shall transmit to the Governor particulars of all Appointments and copies of all Regulations made by him.

3. He shall, so soon as conveniently can be, notify all Regulations made by him to the Colonial Secretary or Chief Secretary of each of the Australian Colonies, and cause the same to be published in England in the "Times" Newspaper.

4. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 9th section of the said Act, the Superintendent of any Province, may, either in the first instance, or afterwards, from time to time, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the Province, except out of any district proclaimed as infected under the said Act, any Port or Place within the limits of such district, and every such excepted Port and Place shall be deemed not to be within the proclaimed district, and the Superintendent may also from time to time by Proclamation as aforesaid, rescind any Proclamation of an infected district, wholly or as to any part thereof, and also the Proclamation of any such exception as aforesaid.

5. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 10th section of the Act, the Superintendent of any Province may prohibit the importation, either by land or by sea, of cattle into such Province from any other Province, or any particular port or place in any other Province, or across the borders of a Province or any particular part thereof.

6. In all such last-mentioned cases such Superintendent shall cause notice as speedily as possible of such prohibition to be given to the Superintendent of the Province from which the importation shall be prohibited, and also to the Governor.

7. The Superintendent of any Province may in his discretion suspend or forbear to

exercise all or any of the powers delegated to him under the said Act.

8. The Superintendent of each Province shall, as soon as can be after the commencement of each sitting of the Provincial Council of such Province, lay before such Council copies and particulars of all the Appointments, Regulations, Acts, and Proceedings whatever, issued, made, or done by him under the delegated powers of the said Act.

9. If the Provincial Council of any Province shall by Resolution declare their dissent from all or any of such Appointments, Regulations, Acts, and Proceedings, such Resolution shall be forthwith transmitted by the Speaker to the Governor for his consideration.
