PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Clause 3 of "The Municipal Council Ordinance, Sess. XIV., No. 2," a petition, from the residents and householders in Kaiapoi, praying for the proclamation of the District of Kaiapoi as a Municipal District was published in the Provincial Government Gazette of the 15th September, 1864, Vol. XI., No. 38, and no counter petition has been received since the date of such publication: Now therefore, I, Samuel Bealey, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, declare the District of Kaiapoi to be a Municipal District within the meaning of the said Ordinance, and that the boundaries of the said district shall be as follows, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-western corner of rural section No. 338 E., on the North Road, thence south-westerly across the branch of the Courtenay (Waimakariri), and along the southern bank of the said branch (said to be the old course of the river) to a point in line with the eastern boundary of rural section 365, thence in and along the line of the said eastern boundary of rural section 365, a distance of about 45 chains 80 links, thence easterly at a right angle about 66 chains 50 links along the southern side of a public street

or road crossing rural sections 321, 468, and 297, to the northern bank of the main stream of the River Courtenay, following the said northern bank of the said main stream and the western bank of the branch stream, a distance altogether of about 64 chains, thence following a line due north to a point on the opposite bank of the last mentioned stream, following easterly along that bank to a point in line with the western boundary of section 1393, thence following a straight line, being in the continuation of the aforesaid western boundary to the southern boundary of section 1011, following westerly along the southern boundary of that section and of section 1002 to the eastern boundary of section 360, following southerly, westerly, and northerly along the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of said section 360, distances respectively of 50 links, 30 chains and 50 links, and from thence returning in a straight line to the commencing point.

A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of certain Persons.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c.

WHEREAS, by "The Naturalization Act, 1863," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act, by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken, until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be and to have been from such specified time a natural-born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed: Provided always, that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act from the dates hereinafter specified; viz.—

LUEIS BERLINER,

from the First day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, native of Poland, draper, residence—Christchurch, in the Province of Canterbury.

ANDREW SANDER,

from the Fifth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, native of Sweden, sailor, residence—Christchurch, in the Province of Canterbury.
