PROCLAMATION

By His Honor SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq.,  
Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, New Zealand.

I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the powers delegated to me, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date hereof, the Province of TARANAKI, in the Colony of New Zealand, shall be deemed to be an Infected District, within the meaning of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861;" and that no Cattle shall be allowed to be imported from that District into the Province of Canterbury.

Given under my hand, at Christchurch, and issued under the Public Seal of this Province, this Twenty-fifth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.
