HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves temporarily under the 19th clause of the Waste Land Regulations; viz.—

No. 376, in red.—Eleven acres, situate in the Ashley District, commencing at a point on the Upper Sefton road, the same being the south-eastern corner of section 2940; following north-easterly along the said road to the road and railway reserve; following north-easterly along that reserve to a point being one chain from the southern boundary of section 6116; thence southerly following a line parallel with the boundary first described to the north-eastern boundary of the before-mentioned section 2940; and from thence returning along that boundary to the commencing point—for Provincial Government purposes.

No. 377, in red.—All that tract of land three chains wide, commencing at a point on the eastern side of the South Line of Railway opposite section 7218; branching from the said line of railway in a curve of eighty chains radius; and running in a south-easterly direction to the Lower Ferry on the Waitangi—for road, railway, and telegraphic purposes.
