SHIP "GREYHOUND,"
LYTTELTON.

THE Immigration Commissioners report that every part of the Ship "Greyhound" was clean and orderly. There had not occurred a single death on board.

A case of measles had occurred during the early part of the voyage, before crossing the equator, but prompt isolation, care, and the destruction of the clothes of the child, prevented the extension of the infection.

The only fault observable on board was the inadequacy of the female hospital accommodation.

The master, surgeon, and officers are recommended for full gratuities, the surgeon for further employment.
