No. 89, in red.—50 acres, more or less, commencing at a point on the northern bank of the river Kowai, where it is crossed by the eastern side of the North Road, following along the said road in a northerly and north-easterly direction, a distance altogether of 19 chains 10 links ; thence following a line in an easterly direction at an angle of 121° with the said road a distance of 18 chains 44 links to a point on the high bank or terrace, the same being 12 chains north-east of trigonometrical pole 8, following the said high bank to its south-eastern extremity, and a line in the same general direction, a distance of 6 chains 70 links to the northern bank of the river before-mentioned and returning along the said bank to the commencing point—for the purposes of a Ferry.
