Return Fares will be allowed at the same rate in each case.

After sunset, and when the Blue Flag shall be hoisted half-mast by the Harbour Master, or person deputed by him, denoting bad weather, double fares can be demanded by Watermen.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORT ON SHIP
"INDIAN EMPIRE."

THE Commissioners, having visited the Ship "Indian Empire," report that the Immigrants were generally healthy, a few cases of hooping-cough forming the exception.

The decks were in a very unclean condition, partly explained by leakage through the upper deck, which admitted both salt water and drainage from the condensing apparatus.

The Immigrants were reported to have shown great reluctance to attend to the Surgeon's directions for cleansing the compartments.

The Surgeon and Master appear to have very imperfectly understood their instructions as to their controlling powers, and considerable difficulty in enforcing discipline ensued. The Commissioners strongly recommend that the Emigration Agent in England should at the muster of passengers on board each ship before leaving state to them, in the presence of the Captain and Surgeon, the full extent of powers of control vested in the two latter.

Much of the trouble reported to the Commissioners appears to have arisen from two young men having passed themselves off to the Captain and Surgeon as free passengers, whereas they were upon the list of assisted Immigrants.

The "Graveley" distilling apparatus was on more than one occasion for several days out of order.

The Surgeon reports that several articles, "phials," &c., mentioned in the list from Apothecaries' Hall were not put on board.

The Commissioners recommend that the usual gratuities be paid.

N.B.—It has transpired that the two young men mentioned above had been allowed separate enclosed cabins; why this distinction was allowed does not appear. One of the single women complained of in the Surgeon's report and official log had to be removed forcibly from one of these cabins.
