PROCLAMATION

By His Honor SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq.,
Superintendent of the Province of
Canterbury, reserving and withdraw-
ing certain Waste Land of the Crown
situate within the West Canterbury
Gold Field.

WHEREAS on the Second day of
March, One thousand eight hundred
and sixty-five, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Su-
perintendent of the Province of Canterbury,
in exercise of the powers delegated to and
vested in me in that behalf, did, by Pro-
clamation in the Provincial Government
Gazette, constitute and appoint a certain
portion of the said Province to be a Gold
Field under the name of the " West Canter-
bury Gold Field," and the limits of which Gold
Field I did in and by the said Proclamation
define: And whereas the Land hereinafter
described is Waste Land of the Crown, and
within the said limits, and forms part of the
said West Canterbury Gold Field so pro-
claimed as aforesaid, and no Pastoral License
exists over the said last-mentioned Land:
And whereas it has been made to appear to
me that the Land hereinafter described is
necessary for public purposes: Now, there-
fore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent
of the Province of Canterbury, in exercise
of the powers delegated to and vested in me
in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare
that I do reserve and withdraw the Land
hereinafter described; that is to say,—

All that parcel of land, containing
twelve acres three roods, more or

less, in the Town of Hokitika, and
known as Gibson's Quay, being
bounded on the south by the Hoki-
tika River; on the east by a line in
continuation of the western side of
Jollie street; on the west by the
western side of Wharf street; on the
north by a line being parallel to, and
two chains distant from the first de-
scribed boundary.

thousand eight hundred and sixty-
five.

Warrant Appointing a Principal Polling Place.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

To all to whom these Presents shall come greeting.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly intituled "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by warrant, under his hand, from time to time to appoint polling places for each electoral district within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such places to be the

principal polling place for the district; and all or any of such polling places at any time to abolish, and to appoint other polling places in lieu thereof. And Whereas by another Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Provincial Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that subject to certain provisions therein contained, every election of the Superintendent, or of a Member of the Provincial Council of a Province, shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," aforesaid; and all the provisions of the last mentioned Act shall apply to the elections of Superintendents, and Members of Provincial Councils.

Now know ye that I, SIR GEORGE GREY, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Acts, do hereby appoint the following place to be the principal polling place for the District of Rakaia, for the election of Superintendents, and Members of the Provincial Council of the said District, namely:—

ROAD BOARD OFFICE, LEESTON.
