PROCLAMATION

By His Honor SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, constituting and defining a certain District under "The Slaughterhouse Ordinance."

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, Session VIII, No 5, entitled "An Ordinance for regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle in certain places," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, by Proclamation from time to time, to constitute and define certain Districts for the purpose of regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle in certain places, and the limits of such Districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require, and also, if he shall see fit, to revoke the Proclamation by which any such District shall have been constituted:

And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled "The Empowering Ordinance, Session II, No. 2," it is enacted that the powers conferred on the Governors of New Zealand by the above recited Ordinance are within the limits of the Province of Canterbury, conferred on the Superintendent thereof:

Now, therefore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me as

aforesaid, DO HEREBY constitute and define the District specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, for the purpose of regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle.

GREYMOUTH DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Province situate at the mouth of the River Grey, commencing at the south-eastern corner of Native Reserve No. 31, thence following a line in a south-westerly direction, at an angle of 74 deg. 13 min. with the southern boundary of the before-mentioned reserve a distance of about 122 chains; thence north-westerly at a right angle a distance of about 118 chains to the sea-beach, following the beach to the mouth of the Grey; thence following the southern bank of that river to the north-western corner of the Native Reserve before mentioned, and from thence returning along the western and southern boundaries of that reserve to the commencing point.

**PROCLAMATION.**

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, passed in the Twenty-second Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "The Provincial Reserved Bills Act, 1858," it was enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been passed by the Provincial Council of any Province, and shall have been reserved by the Superintendent for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon, such Bill shall not have any force or authority within the said Province until the Superintendent shall signify either by speech or message to the Provincial Council, or by Proclamation in the "Government Gazette" of the said Province, that such Bill has been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same:

And whereas a Bill, entitled "The Ashley Bridge Ordinance, 1866," was passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, and the same was reserved by the Superintendent of the said Province for the assent of His Excellency the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that the aforesaid Bill has been laid before His Excellency the Governor, and that His Excellency has assented to the same.

## COMMISSIONERS' REPORT.

## SHIP "VICTORY."

THE Immigration Commissioners report that they found everything on board the "Victory" in a most satisfactory condition.

The Matron, said to have many years experience in a similar capacity, had kept the compartment of the single women in a state of excellent order, and very perfect discipline appears to have been maintained.

The Hospital arrangements showed a great improvement on former vessels. The Commissioners remark with approbation the separation from it of a distinct enclosed space as a dispensary.

The Commissioners learned, with deep regret, that Dr. Cocksedge, the Surgeon Superintendent, appointed in England, died a few days after leaving Port. Mr. Barringer, a medical man among the passengers, was appointed by the Master to take his place, and appears to have performed his duties in a most satisfactory manner; he had previously served as Surgeon Superintendent of a passenger ship. The Commissioners recommend that he should receive the gratuity which would have been payable to Dr. Cocksedge.

The (Graveley's) condensing apparatus is reported to have worked well throughout the voyage.

The Commissioners report that the Victory, taken generally fore and aft, would bear comparison favorably for cleanliness and order with any ship that has brought Immigrants to Lyttelton.

They recommend that all the gratuities be paid.
