PROCLAMATION.

Kahlman and Co., for the period of twelve months commencing from the First day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, at rates not exceeding the under-mentioned sums:—

For every foot passenger ... Sixpence.
For every horse, with or without a rider ... One Shilling.
For all horned cattle, per head ... Sixpence.
For every sheep, lamb, goat, or pig... Two-pence.
