HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves, temporarily, under the 19th clause of the Waste Land Regulations, as an endowment for a classical school; viz.—

- No. 726, in red.—One hundred and fifty acres, more or less, situate in the Christchurch District, having frontage to the Hawkins and Coal Tramway Road, and extending back at right angles, south-westerly, to the Great South Road, being bounded on the east by section No. 5700.
- No. 727, in red.—Two hundred acres, more or less, situate in the Upper Christchurch District, commencing at a point on the road, the same being the south-eastern corner of section No. 7821, following that road in a southerly direction a distance of fifty-six chains; thence at a right angle, westerly, a distance of forty chains; thence at a right angle, northerly, a distance of forty-eight chains; thence easterly, at a right angle, to the south-western corner of section No. 9260; and from thence, following the southern boundaries of that section and of sections Nos. 7870 and 7821, to the commencing point.
- No. 728, in red.—Forty acres, more or less, situate in the Upper Christchurch District, being bounded on the west by the road west of section

No. 8444, on the north by that section and by section No. 8158, and on the south by section No. 8788.
