PROCLAMATION

By His Honor, SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, constituting and defining a certain District under the "Slaughter-house Ordinance."

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, Session VIII. No. 5, entitled "An Ordinance for Regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle in certain Places," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, by Proclamation from time to time, to constitute and define certain districts for the purpose of regulating the slaughtering of cattle in certain places, and the limits of such districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require, and also, if he shall see fit, to revoke the proclamation by which any such district shall have been constituted:

And whereas, by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled "The Empowering Ordinance, Session II. No. 2," it is enacted that the powers conferred on the Governors of New Zealand by the above recited Ordinance are, within the limits of the Province of Canterbury, conferred on the Superintendent thereof:

And whereas, by a Proclamation dated the Twenty-sixth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the

powers vested in me, did constitute and define the Hokitika District, for the purpose of regulating the slaughtering of cattle, the limits of which district it is desirable to alter:

Now, therefore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent as aforesaid, do hereby constitute and define the Hokitika District for the purpose of regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle as follows, viz.:-

All that portion of the Province, comprising the Town of Hokitika, North and South, and extending for a mile outside the limits of the said Town.

Given under my hand, at Christchurch, this Thirtieth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

The Petition of the undersigned House-

Humbly sheweth,

THAT the Town of Hokitika contains a population of at least two thousand householders, and therefore may lawfully be constituted a Municipal District, subject to the provisions of "The Municipal Council Ordinance" of this Province.

That in the opinion of your petitioners it would conduce to the welfare and advantage of the said town were such town to be constituted a Municipal District.

May it therefore please your Honor to take the matter into consideration, and to declare the said town of Hokitika a Municipal District, by and under the provisions of "The Municipal Council Ordinance, Sess. XIV, No. 2," and "The Municipal Council Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1866."
