PROCLAMATION

By His Honor SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq.,
Superintendent of the Province of
Canterbury, proclaiming Hokitika a
Municipal District.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Clause 3 of "The Municipal Council Ordinance, Session XIV, No. 2," a petition from the residents and householders in Hokitika, praying for the proclamation of the Town of Hokitika as a Municipal District, was published in the Provincial Government Gazette of the 30th April, 1866, No. 36 A, and no counter petition has been received since the date of such publication: Now, therefore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, declare the Town of Hokitika to be a Municipal District under the said Ordinance and "The Municipal Council Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1866," and that the boundaries of the said District shall be as follows; that is to say,—

All that piece or parcel of land, containing 640 acres, more or less, situate on the Hokitika River, commencing at a point on the high bank of the old bed of the aforesaid river, the said point being forty chains forty links west of trigonometrical station 31; thence following a line bearing N. 20 deg. 14 min.

E. (magnetic) a distance of sixty-two chains sixty-five links; thence westerly, at a right angle, a distance of eighty-five chains forty links to the sea beach, following the said beach southerly to the mouth of the Hokitika River; and from thence returning along the northern bank thereof and the high bank of the old river bed above mentioned to the commencing point.

All that parcel of land, containing 640 acres, more or less, situate on the Hokitika River, West Coast, bounded on the northward by reserve 271 in red, on the westward by the sea, on the east by section No. 8238 and a line in continuation of the western boundary thereof, and on the southward by a line at right angles to the last described boundary, and about one hundred and thirty chains distant on the average from the reserve above mentioned.

PROCLAMATION

By His Honor SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq.,
Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, withdrawing certain Waste Lands of the Crown, situate within the West Canterbury Gold Field.

WHEREAS, on the Second day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the Provincial Government Gazette, constitute and appoint a certain portion of the said Province to be a Gold Field under the name of the "West Canterbury Gold Field," and the limits of which Gold Field I did in and by a Proclamation, dated the Fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, extend: And whereas the Lands hereinafter described are within the said limits, and form part of the said West Canterbury Gold Field so proclaimed as aforesaid: And whereas it has been made to appear to me that the said lands are necessary for public purposes: Now, therefore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that I do withdraw the lands hereinafter described; that is to say,—

All that tract of land, being one hundred acres, more or less, situate on the road from Hokitika to Browning's Pass, commencing at a point on the said road, being about fifty chains below the confluence of the Kokotahi with the Styx, following the said road in a south-westerly direction a distance of twenty-five chains, and extending back north-westerly forty chains in a rectangular block.

All that tract of land, being nine acres two roods, more or less, situate on the plain at the foot of the wooded saddle, near the source of the Styx, on the road from Hokitika to Brown-

ing's Pass, having frontage of nine chains sixty links to the road, and extending back north-westerly ten chains, in a rectangular block.
