PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, withdrawing certain Waste Lands of the Crown situate within the West Canterbury Gold Field.

WHEREAS on the Second day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury for the time being, in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the Provincial Government Gazette, constitute and appoint a certain portion of the said Province to be a Gold Field, under the name of the "West Canterbury Gold Field," and the limits of which Gold Field the Superintendent aforesaid did, in and by a Proclamation dated the Fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, extend :

And whereas the lands hereinafter described are within the said limits, and form part of the said West Canterbury Gold Field so proclaimed as aforesaid :

And whereas it has been made to appear to me that the said lands are necessary for public purposes :

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that I do withdraw the lands hereinafter described ; that is to say,—

All that piece or parcel of land, containing six hundred and forty acres, more or less, commencing at a point bearing N. 80 deg. E. (magnetic), on and one hundred and twenty-six chains distant from the forks of the Waimea River, thence following a line bearing N. 18 deg. 45 min. E. (magnetic) a distance of sixty-four chains, and extending back easterly a distance of one hundred chains, in a rectangular block.

All that piece or parcel of land, containing six hundred and forty acres, more or less, situate at the confluence of the Kanieri with the Hokitika, having a frontage of eighty chains to the river first named, and extending back north-easterly a like distance of eighty chains, in a rectangular block.

All that piece or parcel of land, containing three hundred and twenty acres, more or less, situate at Okarito, on the north-east side of the lagoon, having a frontage of about one hundred chains to the lagoon, the northern boundary being a line at right angles to the eastern shore of the lagoon, and the eastern boundary being a line at right angles to the northern boundary, to include the above quantity.

All that piece or parcel of land, containing three hundred and twenty acres, more or less, situate at Okarito, being bounded on the north by the sea coast, and on the east by a line at right angles to the sea coast, to contain the quan-

tity required, subject to the Native Reserve.

All that piece or parcel of land, containing three hundred and twenty acres, more or less, situate at Okarito, on the west side of the lagoon, having a frontage of about one hundred chains to the lagoon, the south-western boundary being a line at right angles to the general direction of the coast, and the south-eastern boundary being a line at right angles to the last described boundary, and to include the above quantity, subject to the Native Reserve.

All that piece or parcel of land, containing two hundred acres, more or less, situate on the branch of the Totara called Donelly's Creek, commencing at a point about eighty-seven chains above its confluence with the Totara, having a frontage of about fifty chains on Donelly's Creek, and running back in a rectangular block, in a south-westerly direction a distance of about fifty chains, to include the quantity required.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, setting apart certain lands as sites for towns.

**I**, WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf by the 23rd Clause of the Regulations for the sale, letting, disposal, and occupation of the Waste Lands of the Crown in the Province of Canterbury, and upon the recommendation of the Provincial Council, proclaim and declare that the undermentioned blocks of land have been set apart as sites for towns; that is to say:—

##### TOWN OF GOLDSBOROUGH (WAIMEA).

All that piece or parcel of land containing six hundred and forty acres, more or less, commencing at a point bearing north 80 deg. east (magnetic) on, and one hundred and twenty-six chains distant from the forks on the Waimea River; thence following a line bearing north 18 deg. 45 min. east (magnetic), a distance of sixty-four chains, and extending back easterly a distance of one hundred chains, in a rectangular block.

##### TOWN OF KANIERI.

All that piece or parcel of land containing six hundred and forty acres, more or less,

situate at the confluence of the Kanieri with the Hokitika, having a frontage of eighty chains to the river first named, and extending back north-easterly a like distance of eighty chains, in a rectangular block.

##### TOWN OF OKARITO, EAST.

All that piece or parcel of land containing three hundred and twenty acres, more or less, situate at Okarito, on the north-east side of the lagoon, having a frontage of about one hundred chains to the lagoon, the northern boundary being a line at right angles to the eastern shore of the lagoon, and the eastern boundary being a line at right angles to the northern boundary, to include the above quantity.

##### TOWN OF OKARITO, NORTH.

All that piece or parcel of land containing three hundred and twenty acres, more or less, situate at Okarito, being bounded on the south by the lagoon; on the north by the sea-coast; and on the east by a line at right angles to the sea-coast, to contain the quantity required, subject to the Native Reserve.

##### TOWN OF OKARITO, SOUTH.

All that piece or parcel of land containing three hundred and twenty acres, more or less, situate at Okarito, on the west side of the lagoon, having a frontage of about one hundred chains to the lagoon, the south-western boundary being a line at right angles to the general direction of the coast, and the south-eastern boundary being a line at right angles to the last described boundary, and to include the above quantity, subject to the Native Reserve.

##### TOWN OF ROSS.

All that piece or parcel of land, containing two hundred acres, more or less, situate on the branch of the Totara called Donelly's Creek, commencing at a point about eighty-seven chains above its confluence with the Totara, having a frontage of about fifty chains on Donelly's Creek, and running back, in a rectangular block, in a south-westerly direction a distance of about fifty chains, to contain the quantity required.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury.

**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled

‘The Canterbury Police Ordinance, 1858,’ Sess. X, No. 1, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, by Proclamation, to declare the said Ordinance to be in operation within any town, upon the requisition to that effect from a majority of the Justices of the Peace of the district in which such town is situated.

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent as aforesaid, do hereby, upon the requisition of a majority of the Justices of the Peace of the District of Westland, proclaim and declare that the Canterbury Police Ordinance shall be, and is hereby brought into operation within the towns of Goldsborough, Okarito, Kanieri, and Ross, in the said district.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, constituting and defining certain Districts under “The Slaughter House Ordinance.”

**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance enacted by the Lieutenant Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, Session VIII, No. 5, entitled “An Ordinance for Regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle in certain places,” it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, by Proclamation from time to time, to constitute and define certain Districts for the purpose of regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle in certain places, and the limits of such Districts from time to time alter as occasion may require; and also if he shall see fit to revoke the Proclamation by which any such District shall have been constituted.

And whereas, by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled “The Empowering Ordinance, Session II., No. 2,” it is enacted that the powers conferred on the Governor of New Zealand by the above recited Ordinance, are within the limits of the Province of Canterbury, conferred on the Superintendent thereof.

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me aforesaid, do hereby constitute and define the Districts specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, for the purpose of regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle.

All that portion of the Province comprising the Town of Ross, and extending a mile outside the limits of the said Town.
