BYE-LAW No. 4.

A BYE-LAW for the SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES, "City Council Ordinance, 1862, Section 47, Sub-section C."

ANY person depositing any noisome or offensive solid matter upon any street, or in any public open drain, channel, or watercourse within the City so that a nuisance may thereby be created, or conveying or throwing down into any street, public open drain, channel, or watercourse within the City, any noisome or offensive fluid matter, so that a nuisance may thereby be created, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Five pounds for every such breach of this Bye-Law.

Every person assisting to deposit, or causing to be deposited any such solid matter, or assisting to convey, throw down, or causing to be conveyed or thrown down any

such fluid matter as aforesaid, shall be within this Bye-Law.

The word Street shall, for the purposes of this Bye-Law, be deemed to include all bridges, squares, roads, streets, lanes, paths, and other public open spaces within the City.
