PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, signifying his assent to Rates struck by the Hokitika Municipal Council.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation, dated the Thirtieth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the Town of Hokitika was constituted a Municipal District under the "Municipal Council Ordinance, Session XIV, No. 2": And whereas the Municipal Council for the said district have agreed to levy a "General Rate" of One Shilling in the Pound, and also a "Special Rate" of One Shilling in the Pound, for the year 1867:

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, signify my assent to the said Rates.
